

CHANGING FOR THE BETTER

For the most part, people resist change. We're creatures of habit and we like our routines and patterns of behavior that we're comfortable with. We like life to be predictable. Oddly enough, this tends to be true even when our life is unhealthy or dysfunctional and obviously in need of some change for the better. But the status quo is what we're used to, and the fear of the unknown and the stress of changing keeps us in the same rut.

But change can be beneficial, and the fact is, eventually change is inevitable. It's just a matter of whether we will change for the better or for the worse. During the Lenten season this year, our 40 Days of Discovery have largely been about change, that is, growing and improving in our understanding of life's purposes and in making life adjustments accordingly. God is all about effecting change in us. The first thing He does is change us from being dead in sin to being alive in Christ. He changes us from being His enemy into His friend. He changes us from being Spiritually ignorant to enlightened.

This is what the Bible calls our "justification" or conversion, when God the Holy Spirit works through the means of grace (i.e., His Word and Sacraments) to give us saving faith and to make us members of His forever family. But beyond that, God also continues to work in our hearts and lives through the same means of grace to effect on-going change and improvement in our attitudes and actions. This process of character development is what is called "sanctification." As our behavior improves, we don't become more saved than we were already, we just demonstrate our salvation and our personal relationship with God more consistently and practically.

Have you found yourself making some changes for the better as a result of the Lenten emphasis? Has your reading and small group discussion moved you to make some improvements in your Christian walk as a follower of Jesus? I pray that it has for you even as it has for me. Part of our Christian maturing is the realization that we haven't arrived and that we never will until we arrive in heaven. I've found that the more highly developed disciples are humble, and are always aware of their ongoing need for the Gospel and the forgiveness of sins that it gives us. As Jesus taught us to say in Luke 17:10, we are always "unworthy servants (who) have only done what was our duty."

As the calendar changes from March to April, we continue in the Lenten season. But by April 10 (Palm or Passion Sunday) we'll be into Holy Week and the Lenten season (and our 40 Days of Discovery) will be coming to an end. By the way. here's another change for you. This year for the first time, our Maundy Thursday and Good Friday services will be at 6:30 pm, rather than 7:00 pm. This is consistent with the 6:30 pm service times that we had on Wednesday nights in both Advent and Lent and will be our new routine! Easter Vigil will remain 5:00 pm, since it's the Lamplight service that night. Our Easter Sunrise communion service will remain at 7:30 am, with the Easter breakfast at 9:00 am, and the Easter Morning Song communion service at 11:00 am.

Even though there will be unchanged service times for Easter, our theme for this year is that Easter Changes Everything! While this may sound intimidating to some, the things that Easter changes are truly things that need to be changed! Each weekend throughout the seven weeks of the Easter season will address some aDverse and unDesirable things that really needed changing (and they all start with the letter "D"), namely: Death, Doubt, Distraction, Desertion, Darkness, and Denial. Division). Like "Ding Dong, the witch is Dead," we'll be able to celebrate with joy this Easter season the Demise of these Dastardly things through Jesus' Defeating of Death, the Devil, and all things Diabolical. If you're not one to come to church much beyond Easter Sunday, here's a great opportunity to change that and to become one who makes weekly worship a regular habit. May our unchanging God, work His good will in our lives and enable us to make some changes for the better.




WORSHIP

Consider this:

Let that sink in a moment... to make a comparison, the average fourth grade boy, will spend 400 hours studying math and over 500 hours playing video games.



A PLACE FOR CHILDREN

Here, at St. Michaels, we are so fortunate to have a school where each teacher prays for and with their classes every day. The Bible curriculum encourages memorizing scripture, Luther's Morning Prayer and the Lord's Prayer. A prayer request list is posted on whiteboards and student led prayers include these requests. Every Tuesday morning the whole school gathers in the gym for devotions and prays together, and then they sing the doxology. Then there is Praise and Worship time at 9:00 every Friday morning in church.

Prayer is critical in our plan to teach boys and girls the deep truths of scripture and without an intentional prayer life, we all may struggle. The good news is that the bible itself gives us great encouragement about prayer. Here are a few things we can learn from scripture about prayer.

Jesus is our example. Many places in the gospels record Jesus separating himself from the crowds and seeking the Father in prayer. Here are just a few for you to consider. Matthew 14:23 and 2-:36; Mark 1:35, 6:46 and 14:32; Luke 5:16 and 6:12. Jesus' example of prayer shows how important prayer is to a healthy spiritual life. As we plan, we should take Jesus' example and seek god consistently and intentionally in prayer.

Jesus prayed for children. Three of the gospel accounts show Jesus' care and concern for children as these snapshots talk about a time when parents were bringing their children to Jesus so he could bless them. Check our Matthew 19:13-1, Mark 10:13-16, and Luke 18:15-17. Jesus knew the importance of praying for children. As we prepare for teaching our children, we should share Jesus' love and concern with our own children and other children we know.





Prayer is commanded. Many places in scripture give us encouragement on prayer. Sometimes we might not know what to pray, but God, through the Holy Spirit, will help us do that too (see Romans 8:26). We should always be in an attitude of prayer, trusting God to hear us and answer us as he wills. See a few other verses that encourage prayer: Ephesians 6:18, Philippians 4:6, Colossians 4:2, 1 Thessalonians 5:17 and 1 Timothy 2:1.

It's a great idea to tell kids that prayer is just a conversation with God. One definition defines prayer as "talking to God and listening to him." This definition evokes a conversational attitude where two people are talking and listening to each other. Our communication with God is not just important in the quiet times we spend with him, but we should be the outward example of that communication as we lead boys and girls to discover how to talk to and listen to God. As we begin helping kids discover a closer relationship with God through prayer, they will grow deeper in their understanding of and have a relationship with him.

Build children Lord, who in times of joy, never forget how to weep, and in times of sadness, never forget how to laugh. Build children Lord who in defeat, are gracious and in victory are gentle. When they falter, give them courage. When they fail, extend mercy to them. Amen.





TRIP - Tuition Reduction Incentive Program



Order gift certificates, get money back towards your tuition - It's that easy!!!

Not familiar with TRIP? TRIP is a tuition reduction program that allows you to purchase gift cards for items you would already be buying, such as groceries, gas, restaurants, etc. A percentage of the purchase price (variable by vendor) is then refunded back to your tuition account, (minus 1%). You may also choose to have your refund donated to another family or to the general scholarship fund.

On the order form, you will see a % indicated by each merchant. You pay the full value of the gift certificate, then you will get the indicated % amount, (minus 1%), back in your tuition account! (The 1% is for administration expenses, which in part includes shipping cost and banking fees.)

Example: Order a \$100 Speedway gift certificate (at 4%).

Pay \$100 for the certificate.

You receive \$3.00 towards your tuition account.

Fund management receives \$1.00.

Profits accumulate are posted in your weekly. Please continue to make your regular tuition payments.
