## WELCOME TO "40 DAYS OF DISCOVERY!"

As March begins this year, so does the season of the church called Lent. Over the centuries, Lent has been a time of Spiritual preparation for the celebration of our Lord's resurrection from the dead on Easter Sunday morning. Historically, it means focusing on the suffering of Christ and pondering His passion. It often includes a time of deliberately depriving vourself fasting, something for the forty days (not counting Sundays) of Lent. For some this means not eating meat on Fridays and for others it might be a fast from Facebook. Giving something up for Lent can be a Spiritually healthy thing to do, as Martin Luther puts it in the Small Catechism, "fasting and bodily preparation are certainly fine outward training."

But doing without something is most beneficial when we replace it with something better. So, for example, if we fast from mindlessly scrolling through TikTok videos, great! But what are we going to replace it with? The best thing would be daily devotional time with reading and prayer, and that's exactly what we're going to be doing through the "40 Days of Discovery." Every day, beginning on Ash Wednesday, March 2 (Ashes and Communion at 6:30 pm), we will be reading the book The Purpose Driven Life, which is loaded with Bible verses that help us discover the meaning and purpose of our lives. We will be reminded that everything about our lives starts and ends with God, and that we are not here by accident, but by His gracious design for our eternal existence.

Viewing life from God's perspective will be very enlightening, and will add value to our lives and meaning to our existence in this world. We will all come to discover that God made us to be...

**magnifiers** of His majesty in worship that receives and gives;

**members** of His forever family in loving relationship with each other;

**models** in our daily living of our Savior who lived and died for us;

**ministers** in His service for the good of His Kingdom and of our neighbor;

**messengers** of His saving Gospel to a lost and dying world.

If you have not done so already, please stop at the display table in the Welcome Center and receive your free copy of the book along with a schedule and other literature. There you can also sign up for a small group that will meet for about an hour and a half each week to watch and discuss a video talk, and to pray together for each other. In addition to our usual weekend worship be opportunities, there will an additional devotional service each Wednesday night at 6:30, right after Confirmation Class at 6:00. Come early and enjoy a Lenten supper in the gym, beginning at 5:00.

We'll be launching the "40 Days of Discovery" in a fun way on Shrove Tuesday/Mardi Gras in the gym with our annual pancake supper (serving from 5:00 pm to 6:30 pm). Afterwards, everyone is invited to the sanctuary for a brief musical presentation by our St. Michael Lutheran School children prior to our special guest entertainer, the renowned Christian magician, Duane Laflin and his assistants from the Grand Magic Theater in Colon, MI ("the magic capital of the world"). We're hoping that some of our small groups may continue to meet beyond the Lenten season, but for the most part we will be celebrating the conclusion of the special emphasis on Easter Sunday morning, April 17, at the Easter Breakfast at 9:00 am between our two Easter Sunday communion services (7:30 and 11:00). May the Lord bless all this singular Lenten focus, and may you and I be blessed to be a part of it all together. In Christ.



## WORSHIP

Gathering around God's Word and Sacraments to receive His gifts & give Him glory.

We value worship, as we gather around God s Word and Sacraments. that is meaningful and uplifting, including clear, relevant preaching. We appreciate both traditional liturgy and hymns as well as contemporary music and desire variety and quality in all our worship services so that we might have a meaningful experience of praising and glorifying God with the best that we have. Colossians 3:16-17

Hey, y'all! If you've ever lived down South (or have southern family) you have heard this wonderful second person plural form many times before. It's not really something we have up in Michigan (our version being something closer to "you guys"). Technically, a person can get away with simply saying "you" in English, even if speaking to a group of people.

Did you (all) know that the New Testament is mostly full of "y'all" language? Whenever you open up the Bible, you may be tempted to think that it is speaking personally to you... but this is not actually the case at all. In fact, a vast majority of the time (with very few exceptions), the "you" language in Scripture is speaking to "you all" as a group. If you stop to think about it, it just makes sense! After all, Paul's Epistles and the Gospel letters were never written or intended to be sent to one person alone: after all, here we are 2,000 years later still reading them and growing in our faith!

To make things even more interesting, the New Testament was originally not intended to be read by oneself. These letters were sent to be **read aloud to a group of people**, then passed along to the next congregation. Although we now can (and should) have personal Bible study and devotional time, participating in group Bible study and hearing the Word read to us as a congregation is vitally important. This is especially crucial to understand in our me-first society in which me/myself/I can become our favorite false god.

When you read Scripture or hear it read, remember that it's not just about you. God's Word was intended (and still is) to be heard and beloved by all y'all! God loves you personally, but the Christian walk is not simply a matter of "your personal walk with Jesus". In fact, the Holy Spirit inspired the Scripture writers to write to all of us together! We together are the church, and we share our Lord Jesus and His Gospel together! God bless us as we grow together in the Faith!








## DISCIPLESHIP





Growing in Worship involves children in the worship service so they learn, follow, and participate in the order of worship. Colorful and interactive, this four-page weekly worship folder uses realistic artwork and coordinates with the lectionary to highlight the weekly theme and message of the day.

Features of the worship folder include: PRAY! Child-friendly Collect Rebus format highlights the prayer of the day. Realistic artwork conveys that the Bible stories and lessons are real and connects children to the message of the day.

SEEI Eye-opening activity gets children looking at the chancel, symbols, banners, paraments, furnishings, and rubrics of the church service, offers explanation of historical relevance, and delivers understanding on what they see.

**DO!** Engaging activity reinforces the message of the Gospel reading.

**HEAR!** A checklist of Gospel highlights prompts children to follow the reading. Less familiar words are explained – increasing Bible vocabulary and forming bridges to understanding.

WORDS TO KNOW! Simple definitions provide context for understanding and aid comprehension of unfamiliar words used during the worship service.



## THINK "ARCH" IN MARCH

Lent is a great time to encourage children to focus on their faith. One excellent way to do so is to read Arch Books. Our church library has a substantial collection – nearly 150 choices! – of these classic Bible stories which you may fondly remember from your own childhood.



Even though they have been published for six decades, some things about Arch Books have never changed. The stories always rhyme. There is a black box with an arch on the cover. And the last page is always a "note to parents" helping them to teach important Bible truths from the story – in particular, how it all relates to Jesus Christ.

Arch Books may remind you of your childhood, but they mean so much more. Arch Books have touched millions of children's lives around the world. With more than 60 million copies sold in the last 60 years, Arch Books continue to teach younger generations about God and His Word.

As Concordia Publishing House (CPH) continues to publish new Arch Books, St. Michael has been able to grow its collection. Newly added titles include:

Moses and the Bronze Snake, based on Numbers 21:4-9 and John 3:14-16.

How Enemies Became Friends: the story of Elisha and the Aramean Army, based on 2 Kings 6:8-23. The Twenty-third Psalm.

The Lesson of the Tree and its Fruit, based on Matthew 7:15-20 and Luke 6:43-45.

Paul's Great Basket Caper, based on Acts 9:1-25, 31.

Peter Surprises Rhoda, based on Acts 12:1-19.

To encourage new readers of Arch Books this Lenten season, the library's collection will be placed in a special revolving display atop the circulation desk. Each child who borrows an Arch Book during March, will have his or her name placed in a special drawing. The first boy's name and the first girl's name drawn will each receive a gift in April.

The library is open every Sunday between services from 9:30 to 11. Bring in your children to choose an Arch Book and explore everything else our beautiful library has to offer for children — and for grown-ups, too. If your name is in the church directory, then you have a library card.

## Being of One Mind with One Purpose

Being of one mind focuses the energy and prayers of the individuals onto a purpose, just like sunlight is focused by a magnifying glass and can burn paper or wood. These highly focused prayers and spiritual intents can bring about major spiritual transformations. Thus Jesus wants His church to be united and powerful.

I don't believe Jesus wants uniformity, but wants his church to be of "one heart, one soul and one mind". The strongest armies in history are those whose goals are the same. Like the "armies of God" that we have read about in the Bible. They were unstoppable because they were all following God's commands and pursuing the same goal as God.

"For the body does not consist of one member but of many. If the foot should say, "Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body, that would not make it any less a part of the body. And if the ear should say because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body, that would not make it any less a part of the body. If the whole body were an eye, where would be the sense of hearing? If the whole body were an ear, where would be the sense of smell? But as it is, God arranged the members in the body, each one of them, as he chose. If all were a single member, where would the body be? As it is, there are many parts, yet one body. The eye cannot say to the hand, I have no need of you, nor again the head to the feet, I have no need of you. On the contrary, the parts of the body that seem to be weaker are indispensable, and those part of the body that we think less honorable we bestow the greater honor, and our unpresentable parts are treated with greater modesty, which our more presentable parts do not require. But God has so composed the body, giving greater honor to the part that lacked it that there may be no division in the body, but that the members may have the same care for one another. If one member suffers, all suffer together; if one member is honored, all rejoice together. Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it. And God has appointed the church first apostles, second prophets, third teachers, then miracles, then gifts of healing, helping, administrating and various kinds of tongues. Are all apostles? Are all Prophets? Are all teachers? Do all work miracles? Do all posses gifts of healing? Do all speak with tongues? Do all interpret?" (1 Corinthians 12:14-31 ESV)

We have an opportunity this March to all "be of one mind with one purpose," as we all study and share "The Purpose Drive Life". I'm really looking forward to sharing this "Journey with Purpose" with the entire church.

You've likely heard the word "hospice," but do you really know what it means?

Many of us have preconceived notions about hospice because of its association with death. Unfortunately, such fears can prevent patients and their families from accessing a potentially beneficial source of care at the end of life.

Although hospice is reserved for individuals with a terminal diagnosis, it is appropriate for people who have not days, but months, to live. Care typically focuses on pain and symptom management, which is central to the mission of hospice. Most patients can expect pain relief and an increase in quality of life. Some studies suggest hospice care may even extend life.

Despite such benefits, hospice is avoided or delayed when a family continues to hope for a treatment or cure that will avoid death. Most patients say they wish they had entered hospice sooner. Hospice is most beneficial when families receive its services for a month or more.

It is covered by nearly all insurance plans, including Medicare and Medicaid.

Hospitalizations are usually unnecessary and rare for those in hospice; two-thirds of patients remain at home, with family members providing much of the day-to-day care. Therefore, hospice centers not just on the patient but his or her entire family. A goal is that family caregivers are less burdened and better able to cope with the circumstances.

Thus, the hospice team includes not only doctors and nurses, but hospice aides, social workers, spiritual coordinators, bereavement coordinators, and volunteers. Beyond physical and practical needs, hospice addresses spiritual and emotional ones for



patients and their families.

At St. Michael, our Stephen Ministry also seeks to provide spiritual and emotional care for those who are dying and for their family and friends. To improve the quality of this caregiving, Stephen Ministers recently learned about hospice during a continuing education session.

It was presented by church member Theresa Krieger, a social worker at ProMedica Hospice in Portage. She says it is a privilege to be able to offer love, respect and care at the end of a life.

Theresa noted that for survivors, hospice offers bereavement services for at least a year after a death. This support may include one-on-one counseling, group sessions, or periodic phone calls.

Stephen Ministers also are here for those grieving the loss of a loved one. The purpose of Stephen Ministry is to provide high-quality, one-to-one, Christcentered care to people in our church and in the community who are experiencing life difficulties.


