WELCOME CHANGES

When I was a kid, there was an ad on TV for a hair coloring product and their slogan was, "You're not getting older, you're getting better." That's a nice thought, for sure, but I'm not sure how true it is. There may be some things that improve over time, like fine wine and cheese, but for the most part things don't get better with age. I took advantage of the street pickup in Portage to get rid of our old outdoor gas grill and our portable fire pit. I did the best I could to keep them going for several years, but eventually they were just beyond repair. As Jesus once said, *"rust destroys" (Matthew 6:20).* Changes over time are often not for the better.

But there are other changes that we welcome. Certainly the diminishing of fears about getting the COVID virus and the relaxing of extraordinary preventative measures has been a welcome change. So also is the change in the weather. While we had some nice days in April, by and large the month lived up to its reputation for showers that bring the May flowers. But now that May is here we can be more confident that we can exchange our snow shovels for gardening tools. Also, the month of May often brings some joyous monumental changes in our lives and family, like college graduations and weddings. In fact, on May 11 our youngest child will celebrate her three year wedding anniversary!

Our Easter worship this year highlights seven welcome changes that the resurrection of our Savior brings. We've featured two of them already in April, but we have five more to go which will take us through all the five weekends of May this year. Here's what remains of the Easter season

What's more, even though we offered the *Exploring Our Faith* Bible class at the beginning of 2022, for the first time ever we plan to offer it yet again this school year. It begins May 1 and goes through June. After that (by request!), I plan to teach a Bible class during the Sunday morning Learning Hour for the rest of the summer on the Gospel according to St. Matthew (beginning 3). Don't feel like you have to make every session to attend when you can.

May is always a busy month and I'm sure you've got several things on your calendar already, some of which might involve travel, celebrations, and fun. But chances are you've also got other things on your calendar that are not so fun, like doctor appointments and even surgeries. But whatever changes and challenges May might hold, we can know our victorious and risen Savior is with us and has conquered all our foes. As St. Paul wonderfully put it, *"I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Romans 8:38-39). May the Lord bless you this merry month of May, and keep you in His loving care.*





HIGH QUALITY – CHRIST CENTERED



National Lutheran School Accreditation (NLSA) serves as the accrediting body for Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod schools across the United States and around the world. Accreditation has always been based upon a school's compliance with national standards for Lutheran schools that reflect the essential qualities expected of Lutheran schools.

In April of 2016, St. Michael Lutheran School went through National Lutheran School Accreditation and became accredited for the very first time. Accreditation must be renewed every 5 years, but with the coming of the COVID pandemic, the school applied for a one-year extension. NLSA requires a rigorous self-study to evaluate the actual conditions in place that are related to essential indicators of school quality. These are evaluated and measured in seven specific standard areas. In order to become accredited in good standing with NLSA, a school must comply fully with 30 required indicators of success. After working for more than a year on this extensive self-study report and completing school improvement goals established through the previous accreditation process, St. Michael Lutheran School again gained full accreditation in April of 2022. This time Christ for Kids Childcare Center also went through this process simultaneously with the school and both the early childhood and K-8 programs earned full accreditation.

This process insures continuous improvement and accountability to district accreditation commissions. Upon conclusion of the self-study, a

NLSA visiting team validates that the self-study prepared by the school accurately reflects the actual conditions that are present. In a formal, twoday visit, the team examines evidence, interviews school stakeholders, visits classrooms and observes overall school practices. This visit took place on April 6 & 7 of this year, and the results indicate that both Christ for Kids and St. Michael

Lutheran School scored well above the NLSA national average score.

I am grateful to the staff for all of their hard work and time invested in this process, which confirms that the educational programs at St. Michael are both high quality and Christ-centered. St. Michael Lutheran Church can be proud of their educational ministries knowing that they meet the rigorous standards established by NLSA and exceed those standards established by the state of Michigan. Please join me in gratitude to God for His many blessings and for another successful round of accreditation!

THE LIBRARY IS YOUR SOURCE FOR MORE THAN BOOKS



Good, clean movies can be hard to find, but not in the library at St. Michael. You will see a prominent display of Christian DVDs directly ahead of you when entering the library from the Welcome Center. Some of our newest titles available for borrowing are listed here.

Feature-length films

- **Beautifully Broken** (2018 / 101 mins. / PG-13): A refugee's escape, a prisoner's promise, and a daughter's painful secret converge in this inspiring story of hope.
- **Gosnell: the trial of America's biggest serial killer** (2019 / 93 mins. / PG-13): Law enforcement agents raid an inner-city women's clinic looking for illegal drug sales and instead uncover three decades of murder and infanticide.
- **Risen** (2016 / 107 mins. / PG-13): Clavius, a powerful Roman military tribune, and his aide are tasked with solving the mystery of what happened to Jesus after the crucifixion.

Stop in the library from 9:30 to 11 a.m. Sundays to borrow books as well as DVDs. You can keep everything for a month and return it to a convenient, wall-mounted box next to the library door in the Welcome Center. If your name is in the church directory, you have a library card.

Think you can't borrow a movie because you no longer own a DVD player? Think again! Put it in a desktop computer DVD drive or a gaming console such as XBOX or PlayStation. Plug an external DVD drive into a laptop. Another option is a portable DVD player with its own screen.

Documentaries

- **The Drop Box** (2015 / 77 mins. / not rated): After a baby is left outside in winter, a South Korean pastor builds a heated hatch so mothers can safely abandon their children.
- *Emanuel : the untold story of the victims and survivors of the Charleston church shooting* (2019 / 76 mins. / not rated): Survivors and family members describe the senseless act of terror that killed nine at Emanuel African Methodist Episcopal Church.
- *Won't You Be My Neighbor?* (2018 / 95 mins. / PG-13): Here is a look at the person behind the show, persona, and personality that defined what it means to be a good person and a member of a healthy community -- Mr. Fred Rogers.

Family-friendly choices

- *Clean If It Kills Me* (2014 / 71 mins. / not rated): Stand-up comedian Marty Simpson talks about kids, football, taking it like a man, spelling bees, roller coasters and lost dogs.
- *Miracles from Heaven* (2016 / 109 mins. / PG): A little girl falls three stories in a freak accident and has a supernatural encounter.
- *Wonder* (2018 / 113 mins. / PG): August Pullman, a boy with facial differences, attends a mainstream elementary school for the first time.

We are thankful to Mrs. Mary Wright for giving her time to mentor the next generation of disciples!













BROKEN POTS

Kintsukuroi, translated to mean "Golden Repair", is the Japanese art of repairing broken pottery using lacquer mixed with powdered precious metals like gold, silver or platinum. Once the object is repaired, cleaned and dried, its former cracks are highlighted by veins of the metal running through its form.

To the Japanese, the breakage and repair become part of the history of the object, transforming it from something to discard to a new creation.



Rather than trying to disguise the repair, some feel the art of repairing the pottery with gold or silver lacquer make the piece more beautiful and valuable for having been broken.

That sounds remarkably like the message in 1 Peter 5:10. And the God of all grace, who called you to His eternal glory in Christ, after you have suffered a little while, will himself restore you and make you strong, firm and steadfast.

God created us to be perfect reflections of Him, but because of sin we all could have been cast aside as damaged, smashed vessels. Instead of throwing us out, God picked up the pieces of our broken lives. He put His plan into motion, sending Jesus to pay the price for our shortcomings. He transforms us into a new creation, something more valuable than we could ever imagine, a work of art adorned with grace.

And that's still not the end of the story. I'm reminded of the woman meeting with the pastor to preplan her funeral service. She wanted to be holding a fork in her hands as she lay in the coffin. When asked why, she confidently replied, to remind people that the best is yet to come, just like at the church dinners with all the wonderful desserts. Heaven awaits us. And one day Christ will return to make all things new.

Butch and Marie got married when they were nineteen. They were married for seventy years before the Lord called them home last year. When they were thirty-five, after having three children, they had created their first estate plan with a will that established guardianship for their children and created a minor's trust to provide for their children, providing for their needs until the youngest would reach the age of twenty-five. Their youngest child is now fifty-five and most of the provisions of their early plan no longer are needed.

Butch and Marie thought that they never needed to update that will. There was a problem with that. The original inheritance language from fifty-four years ago did not include the words "per stirpes." That phrase means that a child's inheritance will pass to their children if they die before receiving it. Two of Butch's and Marie's children passed away three years ago from illness. Each of them had three children. However, without the appropriate language, none of the inheritance will pass to those children (grandchildren of Butch and Marie). That would have crushed Butch and Marie had they known it happened. It also created some tension between some of the grandchildren.

All of this could have been avoided if Butch and Marie had reviewed their plan periodically through the years. It would have been worth the money to sit with an attorney. THE GENTLE FLUTTERING OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

Recently I finished reading "Living Among Lions" by David and Jason Benham. One quote in their book really caught my attention because I love butterflies! "If you don't wait for the Lord, you may still have wings – but more like a hummingbird than a butterfly, you work a lot harder and fly a lot lower."

"Without patience in prayer that waits for God's wind, you'll end up exhausted, without His strength and power to accomplish His work. All you have to do is spread your wings (fully trust in God for the results) while He does the work. Thriving prayers require patience and waiting on His wind to come. Before you start flapping, wait patiently for God's favor."

Experiencing the Holy Spirit is kind of like a visit from a butterfly. You can't force a visit from a butterfly. No, butterflies come and go with the breeze. Jesus describes the Holy Spirit in a similar way: "the wind blows wherever it pleases. You hear its sound, but you cannot tell where it comes from or where it is going..." (Jn 3:8). When a butterfly does appear, you're compelled to be still, watch, and simply enjoy its presence. Sometimes when I'm outside alone and I see one flitting around I think, "This is a tiny gift from God, this butterfly, in this moment, is just for me." Then I smile and breathe a prayer of thankfulness for this small sign of His love.

And isn't this how we encounter the Holy Spirit in our lives: in still, unexpected moments? It doesn't come loudly, with pomp and circumstance. Rather, it comes in small, quiet ways. The Lord appeared to Elijah in this very way. "The Lord said, 'Go out and stand on the mountain in the presence of the Lord, for the Lord is about to pass by.' Then a great and powerful wind tore the mountains apart and shattered the rocks before the Lord, but the Lord was not in the wind. After the wind there was an earthquake, but the Lord was not in the earthquake. After the earthquake came a fire, but the Lord was not in the fire. And after the fire came a gentle whisper. When Elijah heard it, he pulled his cloak over his face and went out and stood at the mouth of the cave" (1 Kgs 19: 11-13).

God chose to reveal Himself to Elijah not in power or majesty, but instead in a gentle whisper. Yes, sometimes God appears in trembling earthquakes or in pillars of whirling smoke and fire. But the Holy Spirit usually comes to us in everyday ways in our everyday lives. He comes to us in the sunshine that warms our faces and melts away the stress when we step outside after a long day at work. In the cool breeze that comes before a much-needed rain, relieving a parched, 97-degree summer day. He comes to us and whispers, *everything will be okay. I am here, and I am with you.* The Holy Spirit comes to us in this way: in a gentle voice that speaks directly to our hearts—softly, personally.

Consider this though, if the Holy Spirit usually speaks to us in quiet ways, how will we hear Him if we're distracted and our world is full of noise? It's all too easy to miss small, grace-filled moments when we're rushing from place to place and task to task. So often our day goes from the phone screen to the computer screen and ends with the TV screen. To notice, we must be quiet and observant: "Be still and know that I am God" (Ps 46:10).

Finding time for stillness and silence to sit in His presence in a chapel, alone in your backyard, or even just for a few minutes in your car can help you notice that God is always present with you, loving you no matter where you are. Try setting time aside some "time for <u>peace</u>" each day this week. When you do, first take a few moments to relax, set aside the troubles of your day, and just breathe. Then, watch and listen with your heart; pay attention to the gentle fluttering of the Holy Spirit, however small and quiet it may be.

Come Holy Spirit. Come dwell in the stillness of my heart. Console me, strengthen me, and fill me with faith, hope, and love.
