### "Mighty Angels Matriculate!"

"Across the pond," this back-to-school time of the year is called Michaelmas. It gets that name from the fact that September 29 is the Feast of St. Michael and All Angels. Well, here at St. Michael Church and School its appropriate to welcome back our "Mighty Angels" with a word about St. Michael the Archangel. He is one of only two angels in the 66 books of the Bible that we know by name (the other one is Gabriel). He is also the only one in the Bible that is referred to as the "Archangel," leading us to believe that he is the highest ranking of the heavenly host and something like the general of the Lord's angelic army.

In the Old Testament, Michael is the defender of Israel (see Daniel 10-12), and according to Jude 9 Michael was in some sort of mysterious dispute with the devil for the body of Moses. But the chapter where Michael really shines is in Revelation 12, one of the cosmic visions that describes the primeval "war in heaven" in which Michael is used of the Lord to defeat the devil so that "the great dragon was thrown down, that ancient serpent, who is called the devil and Satan, the deceiver of the whole world—he was thrown down to the earth, and his angels were thrown down with him" (v. 9). This is what Jesus was referring to when He said: "I saw Satan fall like lightening from heaven" (Luke 10:18).

So we thank God for our congregation's name sake, but we don't worship him or pray to him. As many of you know, over the years I've collected quite a number of St. Michael statues, icons, jewelry and the like. Many of them are especially suited for members of the military (note the picture of Pastor Maske in the chapel at Camp LeJuene, where he was serving our Marines training there), or those engaged in public safety. But one of the things I'm always careful to do is steer clear of those who address Michael directly in prayer saying something like "St. Michael defend us!" It would be far better to ask the Lord Himself to do that, and if we like, we could also ask Him to deploy Michael or any other angel that He chooses. This is what

Martin Luther does in both his morning and evening prayer as he asks his Heavenly Father to "let Your holy angel be with me that the evil foe may have no power over me" (LSB, page 266).

If you ever see an image of an angel that's armed with a weapon, it is no doubt a depiction of the arch angel Saint Michael. Case in point, the corporate logo of Saint Michael Lutheran Church has Michael slaying the devil with a spear. But we must hasten to point out that this does not mean that Christ's Church on earth should literally be equipped with munitions or should rely on military might to carry out its mission. To those who tried to defend Him with deadly force, Jesus said, "Put away your sword... Those who use the sword will die by the sword (Matthew 26:52). Instead, Jesus has given His Church "the sword of the Spirit which is the Word of God" (Ephesians 6:17), and Jesus demonstrated in His own disputes with the devil the power of "It is written!" (see Matthew 4 and Luke 4). Likewise, when Jesus' disciples continued the Kingdom work after Jesus' return to heaven they pointed out that "the weapons of our warfare are not of the flesh but have divine power to destroy strongholds" (2 Corinthians 10:4).

So let us enter into this new school year fully suited up with Spiritual armor (see Ephesians 6), but also shining brightly with God's love and freely sharing and embodying the good news of the Gospel. Jesus warned us that He was sending us out "as sheep in the midst of wolves," but at the same time He encouraged us in the midst of an increasingly hostile world to be "wise as serpents and innocent as doves" (Matthew 10:16). May the Lord bless the new school year ahead, for students, families, and faculty alike, and for both public and parochial schools. And may our loving Lord especially bless our St. Michael Lutheran School with its record enrollment, that we would continue to provide "Education with Christ at the Heart," and always be making mighty messengers for Him to the glory of His holy name.





Here at St. Michael Lutheran Church, Jesus' words also motivate us to bring children and youth closer to Him through ministries such as weekly Sunday school, Life Skills class, offering the Children's Message in worship, Vacation Bible School, Confirmation class, or the Junior and Senior High Youth Group activities.

We also struggle to overcome hindrances in ministry – particularly, from a need for additional faithful volunteers. We confess that busy schedules, misplaced priorities and other distractions can prompt any of us to say "NO" to our kids' participation or our own willingness to serve. In prayer, let us determine not to make the disciples' mistake. Let us not stand between Jesus and His desire to



### CONVENTION NEWS

As the Battle Creek Zone President I was privileged to attend the 2022 Michigan District LWML Convention and I would like to share some things with you from that Convention.

Thank You, Sandy Maya, LWML Zone President

First, you need to know that we met our mite goal for the '20-'22 biennium thanks to everyone who contributed their change (and bills) in those little mite boxes.

Second, we have a fantastic "NEW MITE GOAL" of \$360,000.00 for the '22-'24 biennium.





