"YOUR LIGHT HAS COME"

I had been saying for a long time that when we get our new sanctuary lighting we should have a dedication service with the text being Matthew 4:16 – *"The people which sat in darkness have seen a great light!"*

All joking aside, I'm very grateful for our new lighting and I know many others are, too. A big thank you goes out to Greg Wedel for spearheading the project and for all his amazing attention to detail, as well as his personal sweat equity that went into it. Thank you also to Pete Baird of Connections with Design who installed them, and thanks to the many givers at St. Michael who enabled us to complete the project debt free (not to mention the considerable savings that we will realize on our electric bill for years to come).

In Matthew 4, he is describing the ministry of our Lord Jesus and pointing out how He fulfilled the familiar Christmas prophecy of Isaiah 9:

"The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who dwelt in a land of deep darkness, on them has light shone... For to us a child is born, to us a Son is given; and the government shall be upon His shoulder, and His name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace."

We celebrate the name of our Savior on New Year's weekend for it was eight days after He was born of the Virgin Mary that He was circumcised and given the name the angel told Joseph in a dream to name Him, namely "Jesus" (which means "Savior") *"for He will save His people from their sins" (Matthew 1:21).* He saved us by humbling Himself and becoming one like us so that He could suffer the death we deserve, but then rise again for our eternal salvation. Because of all that, now He has a name that is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee will bow and every tongue confess that He is Lord to the glory of God the Father (see Philippians 2).

The Holy Spirit has enlightened us to know and believe this saving truth about Jesus. Like Simeon who held the baby Jesus in the temple, our eyes have also seen in Him the Lord's salvation for He is the *"light to enlighten the Gentiles,"* as well as the glory of the people of Israel (Luke 2:32). In Jesus we have seen the light and are no longer Spiritually in the dark for He is the Light of the world. The prophet Isaiah prophecies about this too, saying:

"Arise, shine, for your light has come, and the glory of the LORD has risen upon you. For behold, darkness shall cover the earth, and thick darkness the peoples; but the LORD will arise upon you, and His glory will be seen upon you. And nations shall come to your light" (Isaiah 60:1-3a).

The Light was born at Christmas, but the Light grows and shines into the season of Epiphany that begins with the Magi from the east following the light of *"His Star" (Matthew 2:2).* These "kings" who came seeking the One born "King of the Jews" found Him in Bethlehem, the hometown of King David. But they were only the first of the Gentiles ("nations") to come to Christ. For the last two thousand years people from every nation have come to see *"the light of the knowledge of the glory* of God in the face of Jesus Christ" (2 Corinthians 4:6).

Jesus said, "Go and make disciples of all nations" (Matthew 28:19) and historically we have done just that. We have sent missionaries into other nations around the world to enlighten them about Jesus. But at the same time, people from many nations have been coming to us here in the United States for work and education and in the process many have come into our churches, too. Some came to faith in their homeland and others found Jesus here among us and through our witness. At St. Michael, we are blessed to have among us a number of first generation immigrants from places in Africa, South Asia, and the Far East.

WE ARE CALLED to make disciples of VERN

The latest "nation" to come into our pews are refugees from Afghanistan. The patriarch of the family we have met thus far came into the Christian faith while he was getting his MBA in Pakistan and he has passed the faith onto his family. It has been our joy and privilege to extend our hospitality to them for about a month, and we've been told that several more Afghan families will be coming into our community and into our congregation in the near future. We would like to offer them an ESL class and provide them a worship service in their own style and language. Rev. Vincent and Sonia lqbal, whom the Lord brought to Portage this past summer, will be very helpful in this regard, as will POBLO (the People of the Book Lutheran Outreach) who has assured us that they will assist with their Lutheran catechesis.

Much prayer has gone into this exciting opportunity already, but our Board of Evangelism and Missions is inviting us to gather as a congregation and pray about it together in a **special prayer meeting that we have scheduled for Wednesday, January 4, at 6:00 pm in the sanctuary** (in place of confirmation class for the evening). Please mark your calendar and plan on joining us for this time of prayer as we seek God's face with regard to the open door He has set before us. There is always the fear of the unknown, but we pray that the Holy Spirit would enable us to step out in faith, trusting that His Word will be a lamp to our feet and a light for our path.

January 1, 2023 – Epiphany Observed Psalm 31:1-5; Isaiah 60:1-6; Matthew 2:1-12 "New Year's Comfort" - Sermon Text: Matthew 2:1-12 - Rev. Dr. Walter Maier III

ST. MICHAEL LUTHERAN SCHOOL MINISTRIES

Annual Report

January 2023

St. Michael Lutheran School and Christ for Kids Childcare Center are outreach ministries of St. Michael Lutheran Church. Sharing the Gospel with students, their families, and the greater community, while providing superior education. We believe that all children can learn and succeed, and are open to any student that our resources and training enable us to educate. This is accomplished through a caring staff of certified teachers and a commitment professional continuous growth to and improvement. We believe in teaching the whole child - spiritually, socially, emotionally and cognitively. We work to provide a level of education that is more in-depth and higher in quality than other educational options in the area.

Enrollment

School ministry enrollment for the 2022-2023 school year includes preschool (64), K-8 (125), and childcare (69) totaling **258 students served**. *Since* 2001, **253** individuals have become members of the St. Michael Lutheran Church congregation through the school ministry.

Tuition Assistance

This year a total of **\$42,250 of tuition assistance** has been awarded to 17 qualifying families. This assistance benefits 28 children or about 22% of students enrolled in the K-8 program.

Since 2005, **\$488,524** in tuition assistance has been awarded to qualifying families. Most of the funding comes from a number of events including the annual golf outing, the Gerri Wheeler Scholarship Fund, and many generous donations. This fund is always in need of donations, so please

consider a tax-deductible gift.

<u>Staffing</u>

SMLS and CFK together employ **37** staff – 14 in the school and 23 in the preschool/childcare. There are a number of individuals, including tutors, school psychologists, speech and occupational therapists, who frequent the school to meet the needs of the students. Portage Public Schools provides (at no cost) certified teachers for Spanish, art, band, gym, and technology instruction in a partnership known as Shared Time.

Tuition Income

Based upon 2023 budget projections, the school will generate approximately 45% of the anticipated **\$1.2 million of income** for the school ministry. While the childcare/preschool will generate approximately 54% of that income. We anticipate a small fraction of uncollected income remaining at year's end. Tuition is collected through an automatic payment deduction program called *Tuition Express*.

Ministry Projects

The school participates in a number of ministry projects throughout the course of the year. The following organizations will benefit from the efforts of SMLS students this year: World Mission; Camp Concordia; Camp Luther Haven; the Michigan District's *Hearts for Jesus* initiative; the SMLC Trunk or Treat; and the American Heart Association. Additionally, our students regularly send cards and letters to St. Michael Lutheran Church shut-in members and sing for residents of Vineyard Assisted Living.

Curriculum/Programs

The school continues to offer a strong academic program. Kindergarten students arrive in 1^{st} grade as eager readers. The lowa Test of Basic Skills standardized test scores continue to be above the national average and fall in the top 5 among Lutheran schools in the Michigan District-LCMS that administer this assessment. The curriculum meets or exceeds state standards. Students in grades 1-8 enjoy weekly art, physical education, vocal music (K -4), computer (K-8), Spanish (K-8), Beginning Band (5) and Concert Band (6-8). SMLS also offers a variety of enrichment classes in a program known as *After the Bell.*

The school has an excellent working relationship with Portage Public Schools. Bus service for our students is provided and our school is a transfer point for PPS buses. It is common to see buses move in and out of the parking lot at the close of each school day. PPS also provides limited special education services and occasionally invites our staff for professional development opportunities.

Sports

The school participates in a loose association of Kalamazoo area private schools for sports. SMLS offers fall co-ed soccer, co-ed cross-country, girls' volleyball and basketball, and boys' basketball. We continue to offer *Girls' On the Run* as well as our community basketball camp each August.

St. Michael Lutheran School has twice been accredited by National Lutheran Schools Accreditation, and we engage in intentional improvement of our programs and prepare our students with skills for real-world success. Recently we began developing a STEM lab and are now providing STEM education to our students. This ministry would not be possible without the financial support and prayers from the members of St. Michael Lutheran Church. Please join me in praying for this ministry, as we share the Gospel and strive to influence the lives of children for both time and eternity.

Over the years, we've added quite a bit of technology and computerized equipment in the sanctuary (i.e., computers, sound equipment, LED lighting controls, and video components). His job is to support and supervise the many volunteers who run the equipment in there and to help them with any technical challenges they encounter. When anything is not working, he will do his best to fix the problem on the spot, and when he can't, he will devote himself to getting the problem addressed before the next worship service. Lorraine Dudash remains our Worship Media Specialist who makes up all the worship slides, and recruits and schedules the various volunteer equipment operators. But Chris is now in charge of their training, support, and supervision.
