RESURRECTION RESULTS

We've all heard what people call "the definition of insanity." It's often attributed to Albert Einstein, but whether he actually said it or not is beside the point. I think we would all agree that it's quite irrational and kind of crazy to think that we can continually do the same thing in the same way over and over again and yet somehow expect different results. No, we've learned, perhaps the hard way, that if we want something different to happen we need to do something differently. In a marriage, for example, we get into predictable patterns of behavior (a rut, if you will) which pretty much result in the same outcome each time over time. If we want to get out of the rut, we must intentionally behave differently and do things uncharacteristic of us. Often I'll tell people who want to see some beneficial change and improvement in their relationship to do deliberately something differently than they normally would. It throws off the pattern and results in some inevitable change, hopefully for the better.

Here in the month of April we have an inevitability and a very predictable pattern that we've all had to live with. It's called income tax. For the most part, there's no getting around it. You may pay more, or you may pay less, and you might even get money back, but you've got to file a return, usually by April 15. This year, the deadline is April 18 on account of the fact that the 15th falls on a Saturday and the next weekday, April 17, is recognized as Emancipation Day in Washington, DC. So everyone has a few extra days this year before the new April 18 deadline, but even so, there is a deadline, a drop dead date, as it were. In fact, so inevitable is income tax that Benjamin Franklin famously said, "in this world, nothing is certain except death and taxes."

So how about death? Is it really inevitable and unavoidable? According to the Bible, there are only two people who ever lived here on earth who then never actually died. The first was Enoch, whom we read had such a close personal relationship with God that he "walked with God," and then suddenly "he was not, for God took him" (Genesis 5:24). The other one was the prophet Elijah. We read that while he was talking with Elisha "chariots of fire and horses of fire separated the two of them and Elijah went up by a whirlwind into heaven" (2 Kings 2:11). There are several others in the Bible who died and then were resurrected back to life in this world. For example, we heard about Lazarus' resurrection in our lengthy John 11 Gospel reading on March 25-26 weekend, but then eventually, Lazarus and all the others who were raised to life did die again.

How about Jesus? We would think that if ever there was an Enoch or Elijah type whom God would allow to escape death it would have been Jesus. But the fact is, Jesus came into this world for the express purpose of dying. Why is that? Well, the Bible says that the result of sin is death (Romans 6:23), and because "all have sinned" (Romans 3:23) therefore "it is appointed for man to die" (Hebrews 9:27). But Jesus however, even though He was tempted in every way that we are, was completely without sin (Hebrews 4:15) and therefore when He became sin for us (2 Corinthians 5:21) He was able to suffer death as our substitute sacrifice and satisfy the death penalty our sin deserves.

But how can we know that Jesus' innocent sacrifice was completely acceptable and sufficient to make atonement for our sin? The proof is in the resurrection of Jesus from the dead. In his beloved resurrection chapter, St. Paul puts it like this: "If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins. Then those also who have fallen asleep in Christ have perished. If in Christ we have hope in this life only, we are of all people most to be pitied. But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen 15:17-20). asleep" (1 Corinthians Jesus' resurrection is essential to our salvation for it demonstrates that His death truly was lifesaving for all eternity. This is why St. Paul writes in another place that Jesus "was delivered up for our trespasses and raised for our justification" (Romans 4:25). Yes, the resurrection of Jesus matters. It's essential and a total game changer. Join us in worship for the seven weeks of the Easter season and celebrate with us the amazing life-changing results of Jesus' resurrection from the dead.

Remember, if your name is in the church directory, then you have a library card! Items can be borrowed for 4 weeks.



If you have a special style of Personal Devotions, please send me an explanation of it so we can include it in our next newsletter. It is so comforting to find that special time every day to spend with God.

Bethany's Devotion Example:

As a young adult I fell in love with Inductive Bible Studies. I pick a book of the Bible to go through, print it out without any chapter titles or headers, and go through it a little at a time, color coding and marking key words to help me see patterns and other observations in the word. I'm currently going through Psalm 119 with my church family. This year, I also tried something new and bought a chronological Bible. I go back and forth between the inductive study and reading through the Bible chronologically. I've been enjoying seeing how the different books and passages mesh together in "real time." When it comes to prayer, my attention span is about the same as a toddler in Disney World. I've found that if I want to have intentional conversation with God, I have to write it out. Journaling allows me to be intentional in my prayers. I use that space to process what I'm studying in the Bible along with bringing the things going on in my life to the I'm working on being less "all or nothing" in my time with the Lord. If I have a busy morning, or don't manage my time well and don't have enough time for my routine, I tend to skip it altogether. I'm working on remembering that my time with the Lord isn't about my routine, but about the intentions of my heart. Rocking some worship music during a run or going for a walk and taking in the sunset have been some of my most unexpectedly intimate times with God! What happens when you miss a day? Nothing, friend. You continue to connect with God in other ways throughout your day and you try again tomorrow. There are no devotions police. God is no less in love with you than He is on the days you spend a long time with Him. His love is unconditional and has nothing to do with your performance.

I probably have longer devotions 5 times a week. Sometimes I wake up late and don't have time for my set aside time with God, but I listened to worship music to help me reset my faith as I got ready for my day. Generally, once a week, I try to take a long walk with no music or podcasts and just think and talk to God as well.

Having a daily devotional time is key to growing your faith. The more you spend time with God the more your relationship will grow, your trust will deepen and the sweeter your time together will be.

Soccer Shots coming to Christ for Kids

We are excited to offer this again at Christ for Kids this summer. Soccer Shots is an engaging children's soccer program with a focus on character development. For ages 3-5 years old, Soccer Shots utilizes creative and imaginative games to focus on basic soccer skills like dribbling, passing and shooting. They also highlight a positive character trait each session such as respect teamwork, and appreciation.

NEW STEPHEN MINISTERS COMMISSIONED RECENTLY



Stephen Ministry, which helps people cope with difficult life challenges, recently welcomed three new members to its St. Michael team. **Zach Button**, **Bob Besser,** and **Pam Seward** each have completed 50 hours of training and were commissioned March 19 as Stephen Ministers.

Zach Button says he decided to become a Stephen Minister after experiencing the pain of losing a close friend to suicide. He said he hopes he can prevent others in difficult circumstances from getting so low as to contemplate such a desperate measure.

A runner who completed his first marathon last year, Zach's daily jogs were repeatedly intercepted by St. Michael members who asked him to pray with them outside the Planned Parenthood clinic in Kalamazoo. At their invitation, he eventually visited St. Michael, liked its familiarity due to his Catholic upbringing, and joined the church several years ago. Zach also is a new lay minister. He works at Stryker, where he oversees indirect procurement operations.

Bob Besser and **Pam Seward** are both lifelong LCMS Lutherans who knew each other many years ago at Zion Lutheran Church in Kalamazoo. They will be married May 6.

The couple heard an announcement about Stephen Ministry while visiting St. Michael, and their decision to take the training class also contributed to them joining the church. They will be officially welcomed into the fellowship later this month, along with others from Pastor Naumann's "Exploring Our Faith" class.

Pam was counseled by a Stephen Minister many years ago during a painful divorce and remembers the peace and comfort she received. She says she welcomes the opportunity to do the same for another person.

Having earned a master's degree in family life education, Pam works as a part-time instructor for the Family and Consumer Science Department at Western Michigan University, where she also is a career development specialist.

Serving other people has been a driving force in Bob's life. He volunteered for nearly 20 years with The Arc Community Advocates, where his late wife, Cheryl, had been a board member. He also worked with people with disabilities in Allegan County as an employment coordinator at a sheltered workshop. Bob is a job setter at American Axle in Three Rivers.
