


### THE WAY TO THE CROSS

As historically many Christians have done at Lent, we too are following our Savior, Jesus Christ, down the Via Dolorosa, the "Way of Sorrows," on His way to where He will be nailed to the cross and die for our sins. The Bible gives us a number of steps along the way, but not all those that are marked out in the traditional "Stations of the Cross."

For our Lenten journey here at St. Michael, we are limiting ourselves to those explicitly mentioned in the Gospels and that gives us one station to observe each Wednesday night in Lent leading up to Holy Week and the remembrance of Jesus' passion on Maundy Thursday (*April 6*) and Good Friday (*April 7*).

For Jesus, the way to the cross was marked with extreme pain and suffering, but it was all necessary for our salvation. Jesus is Himself "The Way" (see John 14:6) and the only way for us to come into perfect fellowship with God, our Heavenly Father, for all eternity. In the Garden of Gethsemane, Jesus pleaded with His Father, agonizing with bloody sweat, for some other way than the way of the cross for Him to save the world. But Jesus knew that there could be no other way and so He submitted to the eternal plan of salvation, and opened to us the way to eternal life.

Many in this world are trying to find their own way in life and ultimately even into eternal life without really knowing how to do it. At the end of their life they just content themselves by saying, "I did it my way." But sadly, as the Bible reveals to us, the way that seems right to people only ends in death (see Proverbs 14:12). No, we need another way, a better way, a more excellent way, we need the narrow way that leads to eternal life (see Matthew 7:13-14). As you watch Jesus make His way to the cross this Lenten season, remember that Jesus is Himself "the Way" going to the cross, realizing all the while that it was the only way that He could go in order to save us from our sins and to give to us



the free gift of eternal life.

There's no way that you and I would be willing to do what Jesus did, unjustly suffer torturous death that we don't deserve, so that others might go free (even our enemies), but that's exactly what Jesus did. Jesus not only took the way least traveled, He took the way that no man had ever gone or could go before.

As Luther put it, Jesus took the way of innocent suffering and death, so that we might be His own and live under Him in His Kingdom and serve Him in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness. No wonder the early Church was called "the Way" (see Acts 19:9; 24:12) for Jesus not only has shown us the way but has made a way for us, a "new and living way that He has opened for us" (Hebrews 10:20) through His blood. Way to go, Jesus!

We appreciate both traditional liturgy and hymns as well as contemporary music and desire variety and quality in all our worship services so that we might have a meaningful experience of praising and glorifying God with the best that we have. "Lamb of God, pure and holy who on the cross did suffer, ever patient and lowly, yourself to scorn did offer."

During Lent we have the blessing of being able to focus on the cross. The next time you are in our sanctuary, take a look at our cross behind the altar. It's beautiful, clean, and we even process into worship with it at times.

But isn't this a little odd? Crosses were used not just to kill people, but to torture them until the point of bitter death. Crosses were used multiple times for different people being executed... covered with old blood and pain.

So why do we have a cross in our sanctuary, let alone our own homes? We do this to remember just how much God loves us. God loves us to the point of death, even death on a cross. As St Paul wrote, "we proclaim Christ crucified"... because that's what God decided to do. To send His only Son Jesus to die in our place.

Easter is coming (and Christ IS risen!), but Lent affords us some time to slow down and remember the depth of God's love for us and the whole world. Slow down with Jesus and take some time to focus your hearts and minds on the cross.

As we move forward in our ideas for Personal Devotions, I would like to offer a style that my daughter, Kari Scare, uses. She is a Book Editor a n d Researcher and works at home. Here is how she finds the time to spend with the Lord every day.



In *Atomic Habits*, James Clear says that consistent habits come out of good systems instead of pure self-discipline. I've certainly learned that self-discipline alone won't keep me consistent with any habit. So, I maintain my daily devotional and Bible study time through a commitment to a solid system. Doing so leads to consistency even when life gets hectic; it even works for me when I'm on vacation. This system includes a consistent time (with my morning coffee right after I wake up) and place (somewhere quiet) as well as a systematic approach to Bible study and prayer.

My systematic approach to Bible study and prayer includes two elements. First, I'm always reading through the Bible in some way, whether chronologically or with another reading plan. This habit keeps me continually focused on the big picture of redemption. Second, I always spend time journal praying. Daily prayer journaling keeps me focused since I can't think of something else very easily while I'm writing with pen and paper. I also avoid electronic interruptions during this time because I too easily get distracted. Most of the time, I'm also going through another devotional series or book to go deeper and focus on a specific area I am struggling with or wondering about. These can be electronic studies through an app, or they may be a paper book or on my Kindle.

While I'm not opposed to electronic Bible study for the most part, there is something special that happens when I read an actual Bible. Holding God's word in my hand and interacting with it by writing notes on its pages as I read creates a deeper connection than I've ever experienced electronically. This is why my daily Bible study system doesn't rely on virtual resources. Just like face-to-face relationships with my friends and family are better than virtual ones, so too is my relationship with the Lord.

### **OUR AFGHAN OUTREACH MINISTRY IS OFFICIAL!**

Our Board of Evangelism brought forth a resolution to our Voters' Assembly on February 26 to partner with POBLO (People of the Book Lutheran Outreach) and the Michigan District of the LCMS to reach out to refugees from Afghanistan in our community.

A major player in this ministry is an Afghan husband and father named Amanullah (pronounced "Ah-mon-ooh-la"). He is a devout Christian and desires to become a Lutheran pastor. He will be working with POBLO leadership, with Rev. Vincent Iqbal of St. Michael, and Pastor Naumann in receiving Lutheran catechesis for himself and family, and eventually he will receive theological training to become an ordained LCMS pastor through the Ethnic Immigrant Institute of Theology through Concordia Seminary in St. Louis.

Amanullah earned an MBA degree is Pakistan, and is currently working at Pfizer corporation in town (third shift). His wife and seven children, and his widowed sister and her three children (whom Amanullah has adopted), all live in a six bedroom two bath apartment at 1233 Jack Pine Way in Kalamazoo (49006). It is just north of West Michigan Avenue and not far to the east from Alternatives of Kalamazoo. Feel free to write, email, text, or call and welcome them to our community and congregation. Culturally, hospitality is their love language, so they love to extend it and receive it. Amanullah speaks fairly good English so don't hesitate to engage in conversation with him when you have a chance. His oldest son, Sameer, is a freshmen at Kalamazoo Central High School, so his English is quite good, too. The adult women are taking ESL (English as a Second Language) classes right now and would welcome a chance to practice with you.

Please pray for them to be able to feel at home here in our community and congregation. Pray that extended family members in our area might join them in worship at St. Michael. Finally, pray that other Afghan refugees who are in Dubai and waiting to come to the USA might be placed here in Kalamazoo county, so that we might be able to incorporate them into our congregation and this new outreach effort. God is doing something special among us and through us. May we join Him in this work and keep on being and making mighty messengers for Christ.



## **Transportation Needed!**

A big challenge that our Afghan ministry faces right now is transportation. Amanullah has a minivan, but it is under repair and not available for a time. But even when he gets it back, it's not large enough to accommodate the whole family. If someone has a minivan, or larger, who would be willing to go pick them up and bring them to church that would be amazing! Perhaps someone even has an extra large vehicle that they could all ride in (like a 16 passenger van). They have a number of car seats and we have two here at church also. If you can help in anyway, even offering advice for transportation options, please call the church office. Thanks!



Ministry leaders often appreciate unrestricted gifts to their organizations that allow leaders to apply the dollars to the current pressing needs when received. A danger of such unrestricted gifts is that they can become generic in our minds, and we don't imagine what the benefit will be some day, robbing God's intended response of joy from giving ("God loves a cheerful giver"). However, predicting future needs can be tricky.

Three sisters taught Sunday School for all their adult lives. They loved children and appreciated the chance to share Jesus with them. Their estate plans all included gifts to support the Sunday School. But today, that same congregation is planted in a community where only 1.5% of the people are below the age of 18. You can see how difficult it would be for the congregation to use substantial gifts for supporting Sunday School when there are no children.

Gifts can be earmarked for certain ministry projects. Yet it is always a good idea to include language that gives ministry ability to redirect dollars if the planned need no longer exists in the future. Your LCMS Foundation Gift Planning Counselor can help you think about the language that makes the most sense for your favorite ministry.
