

"I am a rose of Sharon, a lily of the valleys" (Song of Solomon 2:1)

I knew that each month has a designated gemstone or birthstone. For example, for this month of May it is Emerald with its appropriately deep green color, the color that our lawns have after all the rain (and snow) lately. But did you know that each month is assigned a flower as well? The April showers have surely brought the May flowers, and one of the flowers that is coming up profusely about now (even near the main entrance into our church building) is the Lily of the Valley. Many of you have this prolific plant growing like a weed somewhere in your yard too, I would imagine. By the way, if you ever decide you don't want it in your yard anymore, good luck trying to dig it up! It has an amazingly dense intertwining carpet of roots that give it tenacious staying power.

Could this be the reason that sometimes Jesus is called the Lilly of the Valley? In 1881, Charles Fry wrote a well known hymn of praise to Jesus, singing: "He's the Lily of the Valley, the Bright and Morning Star, He's the fairest of ten thousand to my soul." But actually, the Lily of the Valley language comes from the Bible: Song of Solomon 2:1 - "I am a rose of Sharon, a lily of the valleys." Song of Solomon is a beautifully poetic and rather erotic book in the Old Testament that not only celebrates God's design for marital love but is also an allegory about Jesus and His relationship to His bride, the Church. One might perhaps even consider Song of Solomon 2:1 as one of Jesus' "I Am" statements as in John's Gospel He says, "I am the Good Shepherd" (John 10:11), or "I am the Vine" (John 15:5). But according to the 1,300 page CPH commentary on Song of Solomon by Rev. Dr. Christopher Mitchell, it is probably not the groom speaking in 2:1 but the bride, especially since the feminine form of the word "lily" is used rather than masculine (likewise for the other flower in 2:1 traditionally translated as a "Rose of Sharon").



Speaking of the "Rose of Sharon," that too is title given to Jesus in a number of old hymns. In his commentary, Mitchell points out that while the translation of "rose" is centuries old (not only in the King James Version but even in Luther) it is not a very good translation and he prefers "asphodel." Unlike "rose," "asphodel" is hardly a name anyone is ever likely to give to their daughter, but he likes the fact that it is not a specific floral species name but rather the name of a genus in the lily family, and so it fits with the Hebrew parallelism.

Even if "Rose of Sharon" is not the best translation, I prefer the sound of it and I especially appreciate the garden plant by the same name that thrives right here in Michigan. As you can see in the photo on the cover of this newsletter, the flower comes in various colors and resembles quite a bit the tropical hibiscus flower that I grew up enjoying in Florida (in fact both plants come from the same family). There are many things I love about the Rose of Sharon, and they happen to remind me of some of the things that I love about Jesus. For one thing, they are late bloomers that



can appear quite dead in the spring even as Jesus was very dead in the tomb after His crucifixion and burial. But just as impatient doubters are about ready to give up on the Rose of Sharon, it resurrects and comes to life in the summer, flowering out spectacularly and extensively, and keeps right on blooming well into the fall and long after other flowers have stopped.

Furthermore, the Rose of Sharon wonderfully reproduces itself with little shoots near its base that have their own root system and can be easily transplanted. In fact, if I can just keep the deer from eating them, I'm eventually going to have a spectacular hedge of Rose of Sharon plants at the end of our backyard that were entirely a "free gift" from the mother plant. Like the Rose of Sharon, so also Jesus reproduces Himself in His followers and enables us to spread out and bloom wherever we are planted. By His enabling power, we can extend the "aroma of Christ" (2 Corinthians 2:15) and take His saving Gospel into places where He Himself never traveled during His 33 years of earthly ministry. We can propagate His presence into the very places in this world where He is most needed, bringing His love, hope, and joy to people who are dying and desperate for His risen life. So stop and smell the roses, but while you're at it, also remember to share Jesus.

LISTEN TO JESUS



Dana's Prayer and DevotionLife

Thank you Virginia for asking me to write about what I do in my devotional/prayer time, I appreciate the opportunity to reflect on it and put it into words. For one thing, my devotional time is forever evolving because there is not a right or wrong way to spend time with our loving Father. For me the evolution of my prayer and devotional life began with a very simple youth journal that I was given as a confirmation gift. It had a short devotion, lots of pictures, and a few blank lines for the reader to share a prayer to God. That was the beginning of my "Dear God..." letters. A couple of years later I did start a daily reading of the Bible commitment, which eventually lead me to read through the Bible in a year. It also became my first experience with opening the Bible to my daily reading and seeing the answer to my anxiety when I was feeling fearful and distressed.

I am convinced the daily commitment to reading God's word gives Him opportunities to speak to the needs we have in a very profound and direct way. This has been my experience over and over again. From my teen years and into my early twenties, Bible reading became a regular routine. somewhere in my mid-twenties, I lost the fervency I had before and drifted away from the routine. It was also around this time that we began having children. But then in my mid-30's I went to a women's retreat and it stirred up in me the desire again and gave me a plan to restart my daily Bible reading, which also incorporated the daily journal of a letter to God. The speaker encouraged us to select an accountability partner at the retreat, and we were to ask each other periodically through the week, "Did you have your time with God today?" It was just what I needed to begin anew my daily Bible reading and my "Dear God" prayer letter. Also by writing down the date in my God letter journal, it kept me accountable and I knew if I missed a few days or longer.

Since then, now probably at least three decades later, my time with the Lord is so precious to me I don't want to miss even one, and those letters of sharing my heart with God have also been

opportunities to see His response in my reading for each day. As I said this has evolved over time and I am always open to exploring new ways to read His word and to incorporate other resources, as well.

So my current system is this:

I begin the prayer-Letter with thanks and praise to God for who He is and how He led me through the previous day, and then I follow it with asking for some specific guidance for today and for others in my life.

For my Bible reading plan, I initially began with Genesis 1:1- 10 and Matthew 1:1-10. I read those same verses for three days in a row and specifically asked God to reveal to me insights for my daily life from these verses. After the three days, the next day I took the next 10 verses in the Old and New Testament and did the same with those. Following this pattern, I am currently reading Genesis 46:28 -46:3 and Mark 6:31 - 40. I also use those same prayer prompts from Scripture to pray for St. Michael's leaders and for my family. Along with this, I use a Sarah Young devotional "Jesus Lives" which my Step-Father gave me as another way to hear from the Lord for the day. Then most recently I have added one more thing - my daughter-in-law gave me a "Prayer Journal" Book which gives a space to record a weekly record of Thanks, Concerns and Prayer Requests, as well as another place to write prayer request/answers. This format is new to me, so I enjoy using it to expand my prayer life too.

It is important to me to do this first thing in the morning with my cup of coffee as the start to my day. This precious time with the Lord lasts about a half an hour, but I don't look at the clock, rather I just trust the time into God's hands.

Then my husband and I share our breakfast and a devotion together as well, but that is for another article. If you have not started spending regular time with God you truly don't know what you are missing. He loves you so much and it gives God so many more opportunities to share with you how special you are and how much He is interested in your day to day life. You will never regret it.

RISEN AND SERVING!



A date has been set to recognize and honor Coach Knight with the renaming of McCamley Field to McCamley Knight Field.


The ceremony and festivities will take place on THURSDAY, AUGUST 24, 2023 prior to the kickoff of the first home game of the season.


