"I'm Gonna Fly"

Not surprisingly, the life cycle of a butterfly has often been used as an illustration of death and resurrection. As you know, a butterfly starts out as a caterpillar, and caterpillars and people have a bit in common. Some caterpillars are pretty cute and fuzzy, while others are rather ugly and spiky, but they are all distinctively unique creatures, they all love to eat, and they all have a time in their lives in which they must enter into the tomb-like condition of a chrysalis. While the caterpillar may appear to be dead within the chrysalis, the day comes in which it emerges from it in a new and better condition than ever before. It comes out with magnificent wings by which it can fly through the air.

If you or I were to reduce ourselves to being a caterpillar, it would just be one creature (albeit the crowning glory of God's creation) becoming another creature. But in the case of Jesus, He is the eternal Son of God (the Second Person of the Trinity) and so for Him to take on human flesh and to become one just like us was extremely and remarkably humbling. And yet this is exactly what He did. He became a creature like us, a caterpillar like us, if you will. He was a perfect caterpillar to be sure, but a corruptible one nonetheless for His incarnation as a man was for the express purpose not only of living a perfect human life, but also so that He might be able to suffer and die a human death as the perfect sacrifice for our sin, so that it might be completely atoned for.

When our dead Savior was taken down from the cross He was placed into a tomb as the Christ in a chrysalis, but on the third day He arose victorious with a new and glorified body that was capable of walking through locked doors and ultimately flying up into heaven on Ascension Day. As truly remarkable as this transformation is, it is not unique to Jesus' for He has promised: "because I live, you also shall live" (John 14:19). As believers in Jesus as our Savior from sin and death, we acknowledge Him as "the Resurrection and the Life" (John 11:25) and we rest assured that even after we die we shall live. Now that Jesus has bodily risen and ascended, we can with hope and joy anticipate His return to earth in the same manner in which He left (Acts 1:11), for "we await a Savior...

who will transform our lowly body to be like His glorious body, by the power that enables him even to subject all things to Himself" (Philippians 3:20-21).

At the end of last month we entered into the season of Pentecost, the time in which the Holy Spirit was poured out on all flesh in fulfillment of Old Testament prophecy and, as Jesus put it, "the promise of My Father" (Luke 24:49). Jesus also said that with the Holy Spirit comes "power from on high" (Luke 24:49), the power to believe in Jesus as our Lord and Savior (1 Corinthians 12:3), the power to grasp Spiritual things from the Scriptures (1 Corinthians 2:14), and the power to be Christ's witnesses in the world (Acts 1:8). On the Day of Pentecost, the Holy Spirit did not fly down on the Church like a dove, but He did do that upon Jesus at His baptism. And the Holy Spirit in us enable us to take wing, as it were, and to soar over circumstances and to accomplish the mission that Jesus has given us to make disciples of all nations. It reminds me of a "Mercy Me" song: "I'm gonna run; no, I'm gonna fly! I'm gonna know what it means to live and not just be alive. The world's gonna hear 'cause I'm gonna shout; and I will be dancing when circumstances drown the music out. Say I won't!"

Because of Jesus' victorious death, resurrection, and ascension to the right hand of the throne of the Father, the day will come when even after we die and enter into the chrysalis of our grave we too will arise, and we too will fly up and "meet the Lord in the air" (1 Thessalonians 4:17). But in the meantime, let's not hesitate even now to spread our wings and enter into all the challenges of life in this world with boldness and confidence in Christ. This summer, let's enjoy whatever flights of fancy the Lord gives to us. And while we're at it, let's soar into Michigan District youth gatherings, into Jesus Loves Kzoo (July 9-14), into our Vacation Bible School (July 24-28), into a Synodical Convention (July 28-August 3) and fly all the way to Lac Brochet (August 10-20). Have a great flight!

³⁶ Let all the house of Israel therefore know for certain that God has made him both Lord and Christ, this Jesus whom you crucified." ³⁷ Now when they heard this they were cut to the heart, and said to Peter and the rest of the apostles, "Brothers, what shall we do?" ³⁸ And Peter said to them, "Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. ³⁹ For the promise is for you and for your children and for all who are far off, everyone whom the Lord our God calls to himself." ⁴⁰ And with many other words he bore witness and continued to exhort them, saying, "Save yourselves from this crooked generation." ~Acts 2:36-40

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The Jews gathered for Pentecost were "cut to the heart" when the Holy Spirit, through Peter, told them that they had killed the Messiah. The long-awaited Savior of His people had been killed by His own. **"What shall we do?!"** they cried out.

Notice what Peter does NOT say: Peter doesn't tell them to try harder, or to feel worse... Peter tell them the Gospel: repent and be baptized. **But it gets even better!** When Peter finishes his exhortation, he says, "BE SAVED from this crooked generation."

My students know that I love grammar. Grammar rocks! Our English translations regularly mistranslate the Greek $\sigma \dot{\omega} \theta \eta \tau \epsilon$ as "save yourself", but this is a poor translation. It is a passive verb; it ought to read "be saved"... and that is exactly how it all happens. As our catechism teaches us from Scripture, *"I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but the Holy Ghost has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith."* ... the Holy Spirit, through the Word of God alone accomplishes this awesome miracle. Friends, today, remember that you are saved by the grace of God and nothing else. This is Gospel! You and I sin daily, often and creatively... and yet Jesus loves you too much to leave you to your own devices. He died for all your sins, and loves you every day the same.

People who poke fun at Lutherans accuse us of elevating coffee to sacramental levels. Here at St. Michael, we have the additional sacred tradition of the "Donut Hour." Years ago when our summer late service time was at 10:30, the Donut Hour was really only a half hour (kind of like the Lutheran Hour). But for several years now we've had a full hour between Sunday services even in the summer and have filled it with both coffee and donuts and Bible class (and summer Sunday School). But attending Adult Bible class required leaving the coffee and donut fellowship in the gym and going into the music room (splitting up the group). This summer, we would like to keep everyone together in the gym and foster fellowship between early and late service worshipers even as we also have some special ministry programing from 10:00 am to 10:30 am in the gym. In this way, we're going to have our donuts and study the Bible too! So if you're an early service goer stick around and if you're a late service goer come early. Think of it like a raspberry jelly donut: sweet fellowship on the outside with the really good stuff in the middle!

Through Scripture, Science and Crafts the kids will focus on seven accounts in the Bible that emphasize the soul-quenching grace that surrounds us in Jesus. This series will stretch from Creation to the Early Church, as believers experience the grace of God.

Jean E. "Baby Boomer" Bormann Grimmette Van Lente's Prolonged Spiritual Maturation

It is not possible to talk about the development of my devotional life separate from my life altogether. I mean me, the "wretch" part, can't be left out. I was baptized November 2, 1947, in the old LCMS German Lutheran church. My sponsor was my father's brother, Rev. Curt Bormann, LCMS pastor. Every Sunday my parents, two sisters and I attended our new LCMS Lutheran church, within walking distance.

Elementary school was also close by. I remember shivers down my spine when we recited the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag. Elected to student council every year from first grade through twelfth grade, president of my junior class, God blessed me with many accolades. As for the nice boyfriends, Dad said, "Look for a Lutheran boy."

I went to bed with the prayer, "Watch O'er Thy Little Child Tonight....., with stiff-bristled rollers in my hair, listening to records of "lost love" by Roy Orbison. I remember walking to A and P to buy Reese's peanut butter cups to gorge on in secret on the porch swing. (The secret sins will "gitcha".)

At 13, I clung hysterically to my beloved father as my mother and Pastor Eugene Lauterback took him to Plainwell for treatment of Acute Depression. My confirmation class had maybe thirty. My verse is Matthew 6:33, now etched in my headstone. Why did it take me so long to follow it?

I do not remember seeking God's direction before choosing a university. I attended the LCMS University chapel, and I loved Rev. Richard Kapfer. In my sophomore year I began an eating disorder. Hired by the university after graduation I was on my way to a dean of students' position.

Then came Richard, a lapsed Baptist; we married at 23. Then came my blessed son, Mark. Then a daughter Karrie was truly an answer to prayer. Richard wanted just one boy. I attended First Evangelical ELCA Lutheran church in North Muskegon. As we were building a new house, Richard was going out with a student from one of the Biology classes he taught. Soon, devastated, I was working full-time, with a four-year-old and a one-year-old to raise alone – and a mortgage. I didn't seek God regularly in prayer for help or recognize His strength

and comfort to see us through. I had not cracked my Bible, except to teach Sunday school. I still had an eating disorder, more anorexic.

Then came John, with his daughter the same age as mine. He was an inactive Catholic, a social worker and a good father. We married. We attended First Lutheran regularly, but we didn't pray very much, except before meals. Our children were confirmed at First Lutheran. Working full-time and overtime in a career dealing with the whole spectrum of deinstitutionalization. plus wife and family responsibilities, running and an eating disorder made me "nuts". In addition to everything else, I felt compelled by work to go to Western Michigan University three years to earn a Master of Social Work degree. I didn't go to the Lord in prayer. My father said, "Why are you doing this?"

After 20 years of marriage, at 49, things got rough, and I left Florida to return to my house in Muskegon. I do not think this was God-pleasing, but the eating disorders stopped for good.

I sought Jesus with great sorrow, anguish and guilt. He gave me His Spirit in abundance. I was on my knees more and more. The Holy Spirit filled my heart with a deep hunger for the Word. Since 1996, Jesus has enabled me to be faithful in prayer, now before bedtime at 6 pm and Bible reading from 6 am to 10 am daily. Every page is a marvel to me, becoming more marvelous the more I read it. I don't necessarily get that far because I'm a slow reader, and I am constantly jumping around to find other places I remember reading that bear on what I am currently reading; then I note those other passages, wait for the ink to dry, and go back to the other sites to note all the verses to each other. I pore over, connect, crossreference, make notes and illustrate the pages. My Bible reading has become more of a spiritual and mental gymnastics. No Bible is like my Bible, but praise God He has blessed the world with the same good news, every age the same. Maranatha!

So each year we return we are reconnecting with friends we have made and we are so blessed to encourage them in their faith. They reach out to us for prayer and encouragement that God does love them.



The needs in Lac Brochet are great... abuse, despair and suicide are all common there. But we have a great God and He has given us the power and opportunity to push into the darkness of sin and bring them *true* hope, because the message of Jesus and His love for them is the hope that endures.

The 2023 LAMP team is dependent on God's guidance as we prepare for our summer trip, August 10–20. 


