Thank you so much to the many who have contributed to the cause and made it possible for us to minister to the Dene people of the far north with Bible studies for women, men, teens, and a daily Bible school for the young kids. A special thank you to our own Zoomerang Vacation Bible School children and families who donated about \$700 in their loose change collection. It was extremely gratifying to see hear the kids chant "Lac Brochet!" and to see them taking some ownership in this special ministry. Be sure to join us for worship on Labor Day weekend as the LAMP team will be reporting back to us and telling some moving and exciting stories of their experience.

The very day after we get back from the LAMP trip will be our annual "Mighty Angels Golf Outing" to raise much needed dollars for our SMLS Tuition Assistance Fund. We're pleased to provide about \$35,000 each year for families who apply, making it possible for many to be students at our school who otherwise might not be able to receive a high quality, safe, and loving "education with Christ at the heart." It's certainly not too late to sign up play and/or to sponsor the event. Go to our mightymessengers.org website for further information and online registration.

As August begins, there's still a lot of summer left but if there are things that you wanted to do this summer that you've not yet gotten to do it's time to get with it! Thank you to all who have been faithful in worship and Bible class this summer, whether it was at St. Michael or at another congregation while you were traveling and vacationing. Certainly we never take a break from God as He is with us always wherever we are and wherever we go. That's a good thing because we need Him every hour and every moment of the day. 



As St. Michael's very first librarian nearly 60 years ago, Maxine June remembered the church library when she downsized her earthly possessions in 2022. With the proceeds from Maxine's estate sale, St. Michael was able to improve our library. Significantly, the church purchased а subscription to Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod's highly respected exhaustive Concordia and Commentary Series. St. Michael now owns 44 of these scholarly Bible commentaries that will be accessible and helpful for pastors, teachers, and lay people alike. (More will be added as they are published by Concordia Publishing House.)

Additionally, Maxine wanted to provide a place to display St. Michael's historical books, such as anniversary booklets and programs and church pictorial directories – many of which she has donated from her own personal collection. Thus, a lighted, glass door cabinet also was purchased and designated as the new home for St. Michael's historical archives.

On July 16, St. Michael responded to Maxine's generosity by hosting a reception to honor her and the generous gift. All who attended enjoyed showing our love and support to Maxine, truly one of St. Michael's original "mighty messengers for Christ."



### YOUR MITE MONEY IN ACTION

When you add spare change to your mite box for Lutheran Women in Mission (LWML) your gift provides deeply needed resources for spreading the gospel of Jesus Christ to a lost world. MOST (Mission Outreach Short Term) Ministries is on the front line of sending out those gospel-oriented people.



MOST's January 2023 mission trip to Tanzania was only possible because of the "Ends of the Earth" grant. The team was short on members, and the trip would have been canceled without funding from the LWML. This eyeglass team struggled to find the right prescription for Dora, but eventually found a -13.25 prescription that improved her sight tremendously. MOST eyeglass clinics are made possible through the work of volunteers who collect used eyeglasses or work to refurbish them at the MOST Mission Center in Ann Arbor, Michigan. These glasses, previously ready to be discarded, make a big difference in the lives of people in areas where the cost of a pair of glasses can exceed a person's monthly income. And just think about the potential economic impact of these glasses: they can restore a person's ability to read, to hold a job, to provide for their family, and to have a positive impact on their church and community. Thank you to MOST volunteers, team members, supporters, and the LWML for making all this possible!



### ENDOWMENT FUNDS: BENEFITS FELT AROUND THE WORLD THROUGH THE QUILTING MINISTRY

The quilting group here at St. Michael has been a beneficiary of some of the Endowment Fund monies. It was a couple months ago that we received a nice amount to use at our discretion for our mission projects.



Our mission projects include quite a few

different items that 7-9 ladies make every Friday throughout the year. We have about 2-3 ladies that sew at their homes on their own timetable. Our major project is making 60" x 80" quilts to send to Lutheran World Relief for them to disperse all over the world, especially to areas of disaster. These quilts are used for multiple reasons: a covering for warmth, flooring for their home, a room divider, just to name a few. We send approximately 30 quilts every year to LWR.

Other projects that we make will help local services, such as Alternatives of Kalamazoo and Family & Children Services of Kalamazoo. We make and deliver 10 burp cloths, 10 receiving blankets and 10 mitts, all matching every month and approximately 50 flannel strip blankets and a few baby quilts every year to Alternatives. Family & Children Services receives from us 30 quilts, both baby-size and 60" x 80" quilts, and approximately 50 pillowcases each year.

Everything that we use to make all these things is from money and supplies donated to the quilting group. However, donations don't begin to cover our expenses. Just the money from the Endowment Fund last year covered the cost of 3 huge bolts of batting that is used in each quilt and burp cloth. Those 3 bolts of batting will only take care of the quilts that will be made for 1 year. We also use the funds for repairs/ maintenance of the sewing machines owned by the church. Our personal machines used weekly for the above items are maintained at personal expense. Another main expense is the 200+ yards of flannel used for the baby items for Alternatives of Kalamazoo. Generally, this goes on sale in the Fall, which is when we restock on both flannel and batting for the coming year. Miscellaneous expenses throughout the year include thread, elastic sheets, pins, rotary cutter blades, etc.

We really do appreciate being a beneficiary of the Endowment Fund. We would be forever scrambling to secure funding instead of focusing on creating items of beauty to brighten other lives without your support.
