

"ON EARTH PEACE"

As our Lord Jesus was giving us some idea of what to expect in the end times He said, "you will hear of wars and rumors of wars" (Matthew 24:6, Mark 13:7). But then He also said that we should not be too alarmed about this because "the end is not yet" and that it is just "the beginning of the birth pains." The reality is, there have always been wars and rumors of wars to one degree or another all throughout history. There's probably never been a time in the history of humankind there has not been some active perpetration of violence between peoples, and in our day we're painfully aware of the war in Ukraine, and the war in Israel, and also wars in other places that we don't hear much about that are going on too (like in Sudan where, as of October of 2023, between 9,000 and 10,000 people have been killed). So the message of the angels on Christmas night was not only applicable then, but it is also applicable now and certainly very welcome news for us today -"Glory to God in the highest, and **on earth** peace."

Let's face it, promises of peace can seem shallow and trite. What does it mean to have peace, really? Is it an objective reality or is it merely a subjective feeling? Is it possible to have peace in the midst of conflict, even deadly conflict? If we devote our attention to this important matter of peace for several weeks, perhaps we will begin to not only understand it but experience it, regardless the circumstances around us. As we unpack peace over nearly a dozen sermons and services, it will surely be a challenge not to be redundant, but it will also give us an opportunity to let the peace of God take root within our hearts and minds in a way that is truly calming and Spiritually restful.

Even without the holidays, the month of December is naturally going to be unusually busy and stressful. It's the end of the year and anything that has to be done yet in 2023 has to be done this month. All the reviewing and evaluating that needs to go on at the end of the year is combined with whatever finishing touches still need to be made on the plans for the year ahead. But then, of course, comes the reality of all the shopping and wrapping, decorating and

baking, writing and mailing, cleaning and cooking, inviting and partying that is all part and parcel of Christmas celebrating. It can be fun, but it can be exhausting. And then we inevitably have in the mix the family tensions, the grief over the loved ones not with us, the unresolved conflicts, the financial worries, our ongoing health concerns, and everything else that's always challenging us in our lives with or without the added stress of the holidays.

We can all relate with the Old Testament prophets who often decried the cries of "peace, peace, when there is no peace" (Jeremiah 6:14). No, we don't need a Pollyanna peace that is plastic and unfeeling. We need a real peace, a peace that is "not as the world gives" (John 14:27), and a "peace of God, which surpasses all understanding" that will guard our hearts and our minds in Christ Jesus, our Savior (Philippians 4:7). It's a cliché but it's true: "No Jesus, No Peace: Know Jesus, Know Peace." Please join us for worship not only on the weekend, but on Wednesday night at 6:30 all throughout the Advent and Christmas season. Christmas is such a joyous time – a time of family and celebrations and parties and music, laughter and feasting. Joni Eareckson Tada expresses in a short Christmas reflection called "The Stable" that while all the celebrating of distant relatives who had not seen each other in years and were renewing family ties was going on in the inn, just a few yards away in the stable the Son of God quietly entered history.

She goes on to say, "sometimes the best moments of the Christmas season do not happen during the crowded parties or the rush of holiday preparations. They don't occur in the music and laughter, the camaraderie and feasting.

When I think of special Christmas memories, I think of those quiet moments when God unexpectedly surprised me. With Himself. With an overwhelming sense of His nearness and love.

In the midst of so much activity, so much going on, so many days on the calendar filled with appointments or parties, God seeks out the quiet heart – and speaks to us in a still, small voice.

Think of the stable in Bethlehem. Somehow it stands serene. What a contrast to the celebrating going on in that inn. Who would have supposed? Who would have suspected? If someone had only taken the time to peer out a back window toward the stable. If someone had only dropped what he was doing to leave the party and go check on his donkey. If someone had only slipped away from the festivities for a moment to seek a quiet moment outside.

Just think of what they might have witnessed! Perhaps they would have seen the angels. Maybe the shepherds. And yes, even the Son of God.

Take the time this Christmas season to step outside the clamor and excitement. Visit the stable and ask God to speak to you in the quiet and serenity and stillness. He will.

In the midst of the hurry and flurry, fun and excitement of the Christmas season, let us take time to come aside in sweet, sweet communion and fellowship with the One who is the reason for the season. Time to reflect through prayer and the Word, on the priceless "Gift" of immeasurable value and worth – Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. Time for overflowing worship, praise and thanksgiving – expressing hearts full of gratitude and love








Christmas presents, tree trimming, Christmas parties, Christmas caroling, baking cookies...that's what we do at Christmas, *right?* These things and more have become our Christmas traditions. But sometimes we get so caught up in doing these things that we forget about focusing on Christ and helping our family to have a Christ-centered Christmas.



- 1. **Celebrate Advent -** Advent is a Christian season where we wait and anticipate and prepare our hearts for the birth of the Messiah. Advent means "coming", and we are waiting for the coming of the King.
- 2. **Help Decorate the Church for Advent/Christmas -** Volunteer to help as a family. Decorating the church can be a fun family activity! Saturday, December 9 at 9:00 AM
- 3. Set up a Nativity in your home Put one in each room if you can.
- 4. **Hide & Seek with Baby Jesus -** Take the baby Jesus from one of your Nativity scenes and hide Him each day. Have your kids find Him every morning.
- 5. **Family Devotion and Prayer Time** A great time to do this is around the dinner table.
- 6. **A Stocking for Jesus** Hang a stocking in your home with Jesus' name on it. Fill it with notes of prayers to Him.
- 7. **Family Craft or Baking Night -** Search for a fun nativity craft you could make together.
- 8. **Visit a Live Nativity** This is a great experience for your kids to see the Nativity story come to life!
- 9. **Take a Census of your Family** This is an opportunity to map out your family tree. Then open your Bible to Matthew 1 and show your kids the family tree of Jesus.
- 10. Watch a Charlie Brown Christmas If your kids are able, help them memorize and recite the meaning of Christmas that Linus says in the movie: Luke 2: 8-14.
- 11. **Give 3 Gifts to Jesus -** On three sheets of paper, have each family member write down one thing per sheet that they want to give to Jesus or what they want to do for Jesus this year.
- 12. Bake a Birthday Cake for Jesus Bake a Jesus birthday cake. Sing Happy Birthday and eat the cake!

After this, shoeboxes are on their way to their final destination. Often the final delivery is accomplished by donkeys, small boats, bicycles or motorcycles.

They call it "telephone befriending." Wanting to combat an epidemic of loneliness in England, the charity Age UK has been successful in matching lonely seniors with friendly volunteers who agree to call them once a week. "Sometimes it's just nice to talk," its website states.


Making a simple phone call can go a long way to overcoming loneliness this holiday season. Although loneliness has been subsiding from its pandemic highs, 17 percent of U.S. adults report they felt loneliness "a lot of the day yesterday," according to a February 2023 Gallup poll. That represents an estimated 44 American adults who are experiencing significant loneliness. Surprisingly, young adults under the age of 30 (24%) are nearly twice as likely as their older counterparts – aged 65 and older (13%) – to report feeling lonely, according to the Gallup poll.

Taking a cue from the telephone friendship service described above, the Stephen Ministry at St. Michael especially wants to connect with people who need companionship this Christmas season. The ministry team would welcome the opportunity to chat – over the phone or in person – with anyone who has suffered a loss or is going through a difficult time. A Stephen Minister will listen, care, encourage, pray with and for you, and support you through the holidays or if your need persists.



The young people especially get to feeling lonely and bored, which can lead to risky and even deadly behavior. They're much in need of encouragement and a sense of being remembered and loved, especially by our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

Our LAMP team brings that good news message to them when they travel to this Dene community in the summer to put on a Bible School and several Bible Studies, but it's especially nice when we can bless them in some way during the long winter.

Special thanks to Ailene Buchtrup, a long time LAMP team veteran, for putting together some beautiful Christmas stocking care packages, complete with little toys, candy, and kid-friendly devotional and evangelistic literature. As these packages speed their way to the far north, be sure to remember this community in your prayers and ask the Lord to give them a sense of His presence with them to meet their needs of body and soul. After all, He is Immanuel ("God with Us"), indeed, God with all of us, no matter how far apart we might live from each other.




TODAY | TOMORROW | FOREVER

Sam was asked that same question by his good friend Daniel. At first, Sam felt awkward, finding it difficult to formulate an answer. But then he remembered something very unique about this Christmas. He and his wife had been working with their LCMS Foundation Gift Planning Counselor to put together an estate plan, that would certainly include inheritance for family but would also include a bold commitment of financial support to their favorite ministry and a missionary halfway around the world. Through regular communication, they had pictures of people who had been baptized and come
