“HELP THEM SEE THE STAR”

With the beginning of a new month of January and a new year of 2024, we are still within the twelve days of the Christmas season, but by January 6 it will be once again the Day of Epiphany and we will direct our attention to those “wise men from the east” (Matthew 2:1) who have been adorning our nativity displays and Christmas cards for several weeks. We don’t know exactly when these mysterious visitors arrived, or where they were from, or what was their ethnicity and language. But we do know that they were pagan Gentiles (non-Jews) who nonetheless recognized that the “King of the Jews” was worth pursuing, finding and worshipping. God had been directing them for He gave them a celestial sign to follow that brought them to Jerusalem in search of the newborn king. Thanks to the prophecy of Micah 5:2, they eventually came to Bethlehem where “they saw the child with Mary his mother, and they fell down and worshiped Him” (Matthew 2:11a).

All along the way of their glorious quest, we read that “they saw the star” and it moved them to rejoicing “exceedingly with great joy” (Matthew 2:10). God provided for them a heavenly messenger who led them to Jesus. How about for you? What or who led you to Christ? It probably was not a dazzling astrological phenomenon, but a parent, a pastor, a Sunday School teacher, a friend. It was someone who spoke the Word of God to you and pointed you to God’s promises fulfilled in Jesus. That person may or may not have been a “rising star” in worldly popularity and corporate prestige. They may have been someone quite humble and unassuming. But Spiritually speaking, they were a bright and shining star whom God used to illuminate the darkness of your sin and unbelief and to bring you into “the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ” (1 Corinthians 4:6). Now it’s our turn. Jesus said, “Let your light shine before people” (Matthew 5:16).

God encourages all of us who are believers and followers of Jesus to shine into the darkness of this fallen world. He says: “Do all things without grumbling or disputing, that you may be blameless and innocent, children of God without blemish in the midst of a crooked and twisted generation” and

so that we will “shine as lights in the world, holding fast to the word of life” (Philippians 2:14-16a). In fact, God promises that “those who are wise shall shine like the brightness of the sky above; and those who turn many to righteousness, like the stars forever and ever” (Daniel 12:3). In other words, even if we’re never “a star” of the stage or screen, even if we never achieve the status of worldly stardom, we can nevertheless be like the Star of Bethlehem in the sense that God can use us to lead people who do not know Him (or know where to find Him) to His Son, Jesus Christ, so that they too might believe in Him and join us in worshipping Him.

For all these reasons, the Epiphany season is a missional season. It is a time to emphasize evangelism and our God given mission of telling people who do not know God, the good news of forgiveness and eternal salvation through faith in the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. We do this locally, but we also do it globally. Jesus said that we would be His witnesses in our own homes and in our own backyard, but He also told us that we are to “go and make disciples of all nations” (Matthew 18:19). In addition to sharing our faith locally, we are to go and reach out with the Gospel to the farthest extremities of the earth, seeking to save those who are lost (Luke 19:10 and Acts 1:8).

Beginning January 7, we will offer a special seven week Bible study called “Xplore,” in which we will gain information and inspiration for global missions. Then come February 2-3, our congregation is partnering with other evangelical congregations in our community to put on the “Awakens Mission Conference” (<https://www.awakenconference.org>) that we might discover God’s heart for the nations. You can register online, and any youth from St. Michael who sign up can submit their ticket receipt to us and receive a full refund. So please put this on your calendar, and together let’s shine like stars.

God bless you as you listen to his word and served by him.

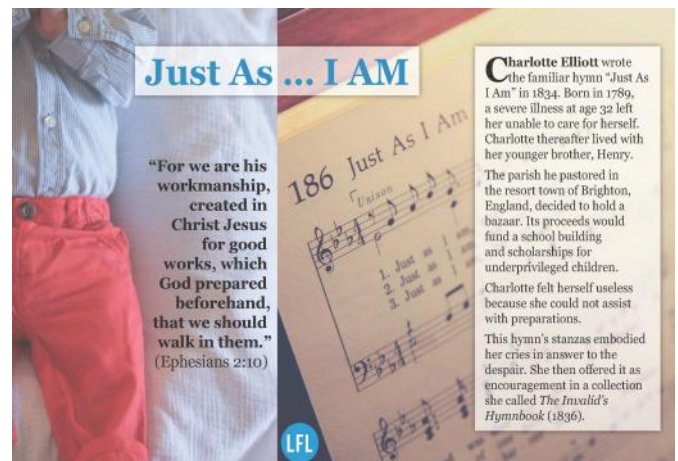

We will commemorate the 40th year our nation has observed Sanctity of Human Life Sunday, which began when then-President Ronald Reagan designated time to be set aside to celebrate God's gift of life, commemorate the many lives lost to abortion, and commit to protecting human life at every stage – from conception to natural death.

Our Board of Parish Education has selected this date during our Learning Hour to provide some activities for all ages related to various stages of life.



Just As I Am ... its beloved lines memorably testify to the sanctity of every human life. Almighty God does "receive, welcome, pardon, cleanse, relieve" each member of our race with the heart of a Heavenly Father and the arms of a Gracious Savior. No ages, appearances, or abilities, no impairments or illnesses, not even guilt and grief can exclude from a place in His kingdom and a part in His family. We get to rejoice in our own lives and in our neighbors as gift and privilege. If our Lord's forgiving favor can overcome sinful failures, then His lavish love will more than make up for human limitations.

"Just" has become an especially precious word for Lutherans. Its verb "justify" occupies the heart of the Gospel. The Holy One Himself gives the reason for every existence by declaring humankind righteous for the sake of Jesus Christ. "Just" means "worthy," but it also means "barely."

Any humanity from fertilization to final breath amounts to enough. God's creating work, redeeming labors, and calling activities never come up short. Persons undergoing surprise pregnancy, experiencing disability, or suffering terminal diagnosis matter as much as you and me. Indeed, they matter as much as the Son of Man, since Jesus incarnates all of our conditions and carries every sorrow. Even when human mouths cannot utter "I am," Lord God lends them His own likeness and proclaims, "I AM!"

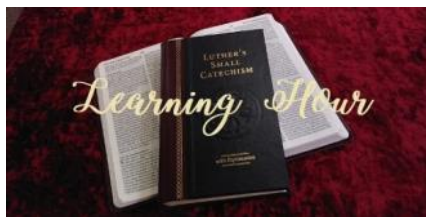

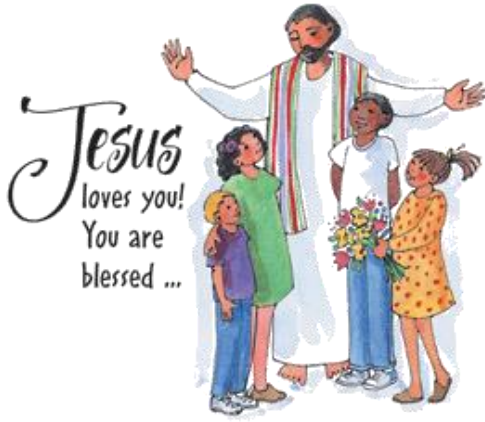

ST. MICHAEL LUTHERAN SCHOOL
Annual Update
January 2024

St. Michael Lutheran School and Christ for Kids Childcare Center are outreach ministries of St. Michael Lutheran Church, sharing the Good News of Jesus with students, their families, and the greater community, as well as providing a superior educational experience. At St. Michael, we believe that all children can learn and succeed, and therefore welcome any student that our resources and training enable us to educate. This is accomplished through a caring staff of certified teachers and a commitment to continuous professional growth and improvement. We believe in teaching the whole child - spiritually, socially, emotionally and cognitively. The goal at St. Michael is to provide a level of education that is more in-depth, broader in scope, and higher in quality than other educational options in the area.

Enrollment

School ministry enrollment for the 2023-2024 school year includes:

preschool (55), K-8 (145), and childcare (80)

Since 2001, 261 individuals have become members of the St. Michael Lutheran Church congregation through the school ministry.

Tuition Assistance

This year a total of **\$52,770** of tuition assistance has been awarded to 21 qualifying families. This assistance benefits 33 children or about 23% of students enrolled in the K-8 program. *Since 2005, \$539,134 in tuition assistance has been awarded to qualifying families.* Most of this funding comes from the annual golf outing, the Gerri Wheeler Scholarship Fund, and many generous donations. This fund is always in need of donations, so please consider a tax-deductible gift.

Staffing

SMLS and CFK together employ 34 staff – 13 in the school and 21 in the preschool/childcare. There are a number of individuals, including tutors, school psychologists, speech and occupational therapists, who frequent the school to meet the needs of the students. Portage Public Schools provides certified teachers for Spanish, art, band, gym, and technology instruction in a no-cost partnership known as Shared Time.

Tuition Income

Based upon 2024 budget projections, the school will generate approximately 51% of the total anticipated income for the school ministry, while the childcare/preschool will generate approximately 49% with a small fraction of uncollected income remaining at year's end. Tuition is collected electronically through an automatic payment deduction program.

Ministry Projects

The school participates in a number of ministry projects throughout the course of the year. The following organizations will benefit from the efforts of SMLS students this year: Camp Concordia; Camp Luther Haven; the Michigan District's *Hearts for Jesus* initiative; the SMLC Trunk or Treat; and the American Heart Association. Additionally, our students regularly send cards and letters to St. Michael Lutheran Church homebound members and sing for residents of local assisted-living facilities in the area.

Programs

The school continues to offer a strong academic program. Kindergarten students arrive in 1st grade as eager readers. The Iowa Test of Basic Skills standardized test scores continue to be above the national average and fall at the top of Lutheran schools in the Michigan District-LCMS that administer this assessment.

*The curriculum meets or exceeds state standards. SMLS also offers a variety of enrichment classes in a program known as **After the Bell**.*

The school has an excellent working relationship with Portage Public Schools. Bus service for our students is provided and our school is a transfer point for PPS buses. PPS also provides limited special education services for qualifying students.

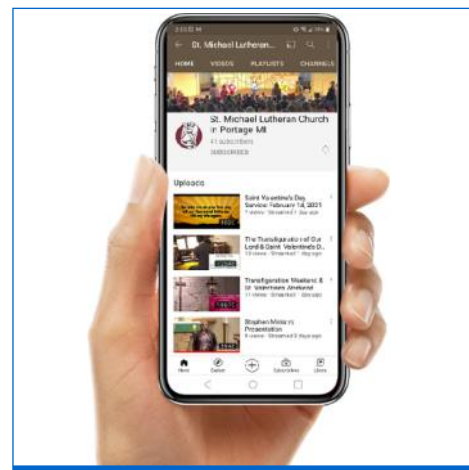
Sports

The school participates in an association of Kalamazoo area private schools for sports. SMLS offers fall co-ed soccer, co-ed cross-country, girls' volleyball and basketball, and boys' basketball. We continue to offer *Girls' On the Run*, as well as our community basketball camp each August.

St. Michael Lutheran School is accredited by National Lutheran Schools Accreditation. We engage in intentional and continuous improvement to prepare students with an education for real-world success. We continue to build our STEM lab and provide STEM education to our students.

This ministry would not be possible without the support and prayers from the St. Michael Lutheran Church congregation. Please continue to pray for the school ministry, as we share the Gospel and strive to develop successful students who grow into contributing members of society.

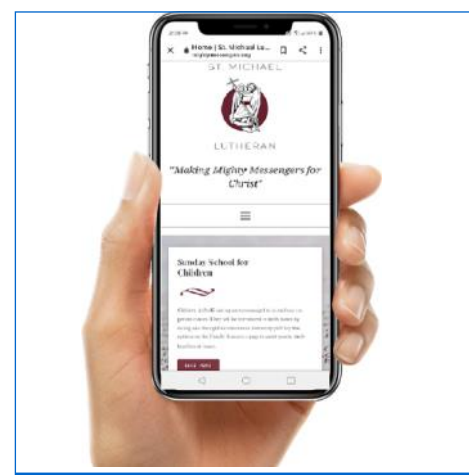

Hi Church Family,

I've grown up at St. Michael, starting CFK preschool at 2 ½ years of age, confirmed in 2016, graduated from the largest 8th grade class in 2016 and worked at CFK over the past several months as a teacher's aide. This church community is like family to me.

Graduating high school in 2020, I was planning on going to KVCC, but God had other plans! I was told by a friend about Youth with a Mission, also known as YWAM. I decided to attend YWAM's University of the Nations located in Kailua-Kona, Hawaii. I had no idea what I was getting into, but God knew!

For those who have not heard, YWAM is a Christian mission organization formed in 1960 by Loren & Darlene Cunningham. YWAM teaches and trains all ages, with emphasis on the youth, to go into the nation's different cultures to share the Gospel. Since joining YWAM, I have graduated from four different programs, traveled on a 2-month mission trip in 2021 to Texas, traveled on a 1-month Europe mission in 2022, plus several mini mission trips to other Hawaiian Islands and even shared the Gospel around the Big Island.

Around 2014, I started developing a dream about visiting Brazil someday. I didn't know much about the country at the time, but knew one day I was going to go there. During my high school years, the dream faded away until I rarely ever thought of going to Brazil.

During one of my YWAM schoolings near the end of 2020, our teacher directed the class to take a few minutes and ask God for a nation to be put on our hearts. As I was praying, I instantly heard the nation “Brazil”. Then again in 2022, God spoke clearly to me about moving to Brazil as a long-term missionary.

During June of 2023, I had the opportunity to visit Brazil. It was an amazing trip! While I was there, God opened a door for me to move to Brazil in January 2024! After much prayer, I felt like this was the direction God was leading me. I am moving to a YWAM base in Brazil called Monte das Aguas on January 2, initially for a 2-year commitment. I am beyond excited for this opportunity and this experience!

It is cool to see that from an early age, God was already planting seeds in my heart for the people of Brazil. Now he has called me to go to this nation. Looks like SMLC and SMLS raised a Mighty Messenger for Christ.

I want to thank everyone who has supported me with prayer and donations to my mission fund. I am certain that I will need continued prayer and your financial support. I will keep you updated about my Brazil mission adventure and my financial needs.

It is with great gratitude and joy that we announce the establishment of the Kuhlman School Scholarship Endowment Fund. The fund will generate scholarship money to be used as tuition assistance for St. Michael Lutheran School students. It is being established to honor Fred and Erma Kuhlman, and Willis and Sussie Kuhlman.

The Kuhlman family believes very much in a Christian sponsored education for youth. St. Michael Lutheran School is an excellent school providing Christ-centered education to the youth in the Kalamazoo and Portage area. Louis and Brett were having coffee, the day after Christmas. Both were sharing with each other about how much their families have changed. Children are talking about retirement. Grandchildren are out of college and advancing in their careers. Brett said to Louis, “When Sally and I put our estate plan together 25 years ago, we felt a great responsibility to provide for our family, as they seemed to have so many needs. But now it seems to have changed somewhat. Even my youngest grandchild is better off financially than I am. But I do have a grandchild with special needs, and we are wondering what we should do for her. We also think a lot about our Church and its future as times are changing. We are also stirred by the LCMS missionary who talked about the impact of the Gospel on families over in Kenya. We know we

need to update our plan, but it seems so complex and chaotic. We just don’t know where to start.”

Brett’s predicament is not uncommon. Most people find that their life situations and the tug of the Gospel urge them to update their gift plans. We certainly do not live in a static world. It is therefore a good practice to review the gift plan within one’s estate plan every so often, whenever you feel life has changed. That look may certainly bring some effort.
