## "CHRIST, OUR LIFE"

A very important thing to appreciate about Jesus is that His experiences and accomplishments during His earthly ministry were never purely for His own sake. They were for our sake. Jesus said that He came into this world not to be served by us but to serve us (see Matthew 20:28, etc.). Yes, He was obedient to the will of His Heavenly Father, but the will of His Father was our salvation - "for God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him would not perish but have everlasting life" (John 3:16). That mean that Jesus was born for us: He was circumcised for us: He lived a perfect life for us; He was baptized for us; He suffered for us; He was crucified for us; He was buried for us; He rose again from the dead for us, and He ascended into heaven for us.

This is why Jesus says "because I live, you also will live" (John 14:19). This is why St. Paul says we are "in Christ" (e.g., 1 Corinthians 15:22; 2 Corinthians 5:17; Ephesians 2:6; Philippians 1:1; etc.) such that the benefits of His perfect life, death, and resurrection have been applied to us by faith. His crucifixion, burial, and resurrection became ours in our baptism into Christ (see Romans 6). Now that we are "in Christ," not only do we benefit from all that He has accomplished on our behalf, but we also live a new life in Him. St. Paul describes it like this: "I have been crucified with Christ. It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me. And the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the

Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me" (Galatians 2:20).

During the seven week Easter season that is before us, we will be celebrating both the resurrection of Jesus and our own resurrection in Him. The Bible first calls our conversion "the resurrection" (Revelation 20:5-6), because we go from being "dead in sin" to being "alive in Christ" when we believe in Him and apprehend His grace by faith (see Ephesians 2:1-10). Our other resurrection will be quite literally like Jesus' resurrection for He has promised that after we die He will raise our dead body from the grave on the last day (see John 5:25-29) and give us a new resurrected body that is "like unto His glorious body" (Philippians 3:21). So it is, then, that when we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus we're not only celebrating His resurrection but also our own in Him. Christ is our life! St. Paul says it well: "If then you were raised together with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated on the right hand of God. Set your mind on the things that are above, not on the things that are on the earth. For you died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ, our life, is revealed, then you will also be revealed with Him in glory" (Colossians 3:1-4).

### A CRASH COURSE IN CHRISTIAN CARING

Galatians 6:2 -

"Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ."

Caregiving is an immense burden. You're expected to meet someone else's needs, all while keeping normal life afloat. You feel weary, lonely, hopeless, and frazzled. Perhaps you wonder if anyone notices you as more attention is given to the person under your care.

When the road seems endless, God provides what we need for today. When we feel abandoned, His Word reminds us that we are not alone. When we face hard decisions, He offers wisdom and peace. When we're at the end of our rope, He soothes us with comfort and fills us with strength.

To help ease the burden of caregiving through Biblical principles, the following five Adult Sunday School classes will be presented in April.

The Fine Art of Listening and Conversation – This session provides tips on really hearing what your family member or friend is saying. If you used to think you were a good listener but now realize you were listening to fix the problem or formulate a response, learn the art of listening to just hear what the person is saying. Learn to listen with your heart.

Who and What is a Caregiver – Caregivers can be spouses, partners, adult children, parents, other relatives (e.g., siblings, aunts, nieces/nephews, in-laws, grandchildren), friends, and neighbors. Anyone who is "going that extra mile" for a loved one, especially during a crisis in the other person's life, is a caregiver. This session helps to better understand the role of caregiver.

What to Say and What Not to Say – What do you say when you don't know what to say? Learn what can help to heal or might hurt another person.


Being Assertive (Say What You Mean and Mean What You Say) – Words are extremely powerful in personal relationships, so it is very important to think carefully before you speak. Your words and actions must be justified by careful evaluation of what the other person has said or done to ensure that you say what you mean and mean what you say.

<u>Building and Keeping Trust</u> – *Trust is important in any relationship as it points to how much you can lean on another person. Without trust, insecurities and doubts can take over the relationship.* Get tips on how to build and keep trust in your relationships.

#### A good gift plan can present solutions to challenging family dynamics.

Years ago, a husband and wife were meeting with their LCMS Foundation Gift Planning Counselor. Both had been married before, as their spouses had been called home to Jesus. Each of them brought children into the relationship. The assets they brought were not equal. Urged by the advice of various people, they began considering a way in which they could isolate their assets from each other, creating multiple trusts. Complicating matters, because they truly loved each other, they wanted to provide for each other when the first of them was called home. They felt uncomfortable about such absolute separation of their assets if they truly were going to share their lives as "one flesh", in keeping with the model of marriage from Genesis 1. They laid out a complicated stream of thoughts before the LCMS Gift Planning Counselor. After a lengthy conversation, the gift planning counselor noticed an interesting phenomenon about their assets relative to family. Coming into this marriage, one spouse had twice as many financial assets as the other. That same spouse with the greater assets also had twice as many children as the other spouse. The ratio made sense. If they combined their assets and equally divided them among all their children, each child would receive the same amount as if they had put in place a complicated legal set of trusts to separate their assets. The Gift Planning Counselor conveyed a message to their attorney, and they immerged from that attorney with a simple plan that made them feel content. The plan they created together also allowed them, together, to make some gifts to support ministry in the future. In addition, this plan did not foster an imposed separation between their children.

Taking the time for extended conversation and prayer allowed this couple to discern the right thing to do, rather than pursuing plans that would be expensive, complicated, and less than satisfying. Your LCMS Foundation Gift Planning Counselor is available to meet with you in the same way.


