THE SPIRIT OF MAY

As we enter into the month of May, we're entering into a time that can be just as busy and eventful as "the holidays" that come at the end of the year. For example, the month of May may be a time for a wedding (or a wedding anniversary) celebration. May brings many graduation celebrations. We'll be celebrating our St. Michael Lutheran School 8th grade graduates on May 28 (at 7:00 pm), and May 23 is graduation for Portage Northern High School and May 31 for Portage Central High School. While WMU had spring commencement already in April, several colleges and universities hold theirs in May. including our Concordia University Ann Arbor on Mav includes Memorial Mav commemorating those who sacrificed their lives in service of our country, and that weekend also tends to celebrate the unofficial beginning of summer when it's safe to put in your garden and/or your boat dock and begin celebrating the great outdoors.

May, of course, is also the month for Mother's Day (May 12 this year) when we express our love, thanks, and appreciation for our moms, including our mother-in-law. Here at St. Michael, the third Sunday in May is historically when we have our Confirmation Day (at the 11:00 am service). That morning, ten young people (who have spent at least three years in preparation) will be affirming the Christian Faith into which they were baptized and making public promises of life-long faithfulness to God. As it works out in the liturgical calendar this year (with the early date we had for Easter) the Day of Pentecost also falls in the month of May and coincides with our Confirmation Day. So clearly there is a lot to celebrate in this month of May, and that's not to mention any additional celebrations in your own family like birthdays, baby showers, and family reunions.

Could there possibly be anything that might bring all these various celebrations together into a unified whole? I think we could find that in the person of God, the Holy Spirit, the third person of the Trinity. On the Day of Pentecost (which comes 50 days after Easter), we celebrate the fact that the Holy Spirit came upon "all flesh" (Joel 2:28 and Acts 2:17) and that ever since then all believers in Jesus Christ as their personal Savior and Lord have the Holy Spirit indwelling them, making their bodies "a temple of the Holy Spirit" (1 Corinthians 6:19),

and likewise, giving birth to the Church of Jesus Christ, which St. Paul writes is also God's "holy temple" (1 Corinthians 3:16-17 and Ephesians 2:18-22).

So how might the Holy Spirit be involved in all these May celebrations? First of all, if May is a month for matrimony, we can acknowledge the presence of the Holy Spirit in a good Christian marriage as the essential tie that binds the couple together so that union would not be broken" (Ecclesiastes 4:12). If May is a month for academic graduations, we can recognize that "The fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom, and the knowledge of the Holy One is insight" (Proverbs 9:10). Education at its best, is the pursuit and inculcation of the truth, and our Lord Jesus called the Holy Spirit "the Spirit of truth" and said that He would lead us "into all truth" (John 14:17; 16:13). This would, of course, also include Christian education (as we say at St. Michael Lutheran School, "Christian Education with Christ at the Heart") and all the discipling that goes on by both parents and pastors together in preparing young people for the Rite of Confirmation.

How about Mother's Day - what does it have to do with the Holy Spirit? Given that within the Trinity, we have God the Father and God the Son, it would make sense that the Holy Spirit is the Mother. But the Bible doesn't speak this way. Jesus used masculine pronouns for the Holy Spirit, not because the Holy Spirit is "male," as such, but to emphasize that the Holy Spirit is a person and not merely a power or a force (that's why it's not part of Christian liturgy to say, "The force be with you!"). The reality is, the Holy Spirit is a spirit (even as is God the Father), such that He doesn't have a human body like Jesus does. He can take on a bodily form if desired, like when at Jesus' baptism He was in the form of a dove. But the only Person within the divine Trinity that has a human/male body is Jesus. But having said that, there are characteristics of a godly mother that are derived from the Holy Spirit. For example, Jesus called the Holy Spirit the paracletos, a difficult to translate Greek word that literally means the "called-beside-one." Consequently, its rendered into English as "Helper," "Advocate," "Counselor," and "Comforter." When you think about it, these are all apt descriptions of who our mother often has been to us, and perhaps

still is. Ideally, a mother comes beside her children to encourage them, exhort them, direct them and lead them as appropriate. Very often our mother was the one who taught us many practical things about life, and best of all, our mother may have been one who taught us about Jesus. He said that the Holy Spirit would "take what is Mine and declare it to you" (John 16-14-15) and in many instances God the Holy Spirit used our mothers to do just that.

Jesus assured His disciples that He would not leave them as orphans (John 14:18) because the Holy Spirit would come to them and be with them and in them. So even if our mother and father are no longer living, we are never really an orphan when we have God the Holy Spirit indwelling within us. He brings us into God's forever family, and makes us His beloved children. As St. Paul put it, "you did not receive the spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received the Spirit of adoption as sons... The Spirit Himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God" (Romans 8:15-16). So happy Mother's Day, blessed Pentecost, and may you all have a wonderful celebration of this merry, merry month of May. In Christ,





A CRASH COURSE IN CHRISTIAN CARING

<u>Galatians 6:10</u> ~ "Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers."

On April 28, we continued our class on Christian Caring with a discussion on "What to Say and What Not to Say".

In caring for others, it is important that we not get the process mixed up with the results. Faith and trust are the results we hope for, but we need to remember the motto for caring for others - "We are the Caregivers - God is the Curegiver". The best way we can care for others is to help them feel free to fully express what's in their hearts and minds - trusting that, by grace, God will grant them the faith they need to find growth, peace, and healing.

On May 5, we will continue our discussion with "Say What you Mean and Mean What you Say". Words are extremely powerful in personal relationships, so it is very important to think carefully before you speak. Your words and actions must be justified by careful evaluation of what the other person has said or done to ensure that you say what you mean and mean what you say.

Two important things we will talk about in these discussions will be: Grace-Based Acceptance and How to be a Non-Judgmental listener. Some people will be worried about how we will react to some of the things they may share, however, you will want to make them feel safe about sharing their concerns with you.

We will talk about ways to ask questions and encourage sharing. Also, how to avoid platitudes or fix-it-answers.

Finally, on May 12, we will talk about Building and Keeping Trust – Trust is important in any relationship as it points to how much you can lean on another person. Without trust insecurities and doubts can take over the relationship. Get tips on how to build and keep trust in your relationships (personal and professional).

I pray that these discussions will draw you closer to God and the work he has for us to do in encouraging our fellow believers.

"My congregation won't know what to do with a gift if I leave something from my estate." That is where the conversation turned between two friends having coffee one afternoon. The other responded, "I thought our Church had an endowment fund. Have you considered giving to that?" "I hate to admit it, but I really don't know what it is about. I've heard financial reports at congregational meetings, but it just seemed like numbers. It's my fault, but I have never investigated what that fund does."

This experience is quite common for many of us. Our world is so full of information that we have to decide about what we will consider and when we will consider it. It may be true that we haven't spent much time thinking about charitable gifting from our estates and so we have not paid much attention to something like our congregation's endowment fund, or future ministry fund.


