WELCOME TO THE JUNGLE

"It's a jungle out there, disorder and confusion everywhere, no one seems to care. . . It's a jungle out there!" While these song lyrics by Randy Newman accompany the opening credits of the TV detective series "Monk," they just as well could describe the state of our messed up world today. War continues to rage in the Middle East and in Eastern Europe even as senseless violence Moral abounds here at home. confusion characterizes our culture and its perversion plagues our society, our schools, and even our civil government. Then, in the midst of all this, sometimes random disasters can befall us in the form of severe weather or unexpected injury or serious illness. It's enough to move many to seek escape through unhealthy habits or to retreat into virtual reality.

Just as life in this world can seem to be totally out of control, we are reminded in God's Word that He is sovereign and actually in control of all things. The Bible assures us that our Lord Jesus Christ "is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation. For by Him all things were created, in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities-all things were created through Him and for Him. And He is before all things, and in Him all things hold together. And He is the head of the body the church. He is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in everything he might be preeminent. For in Him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, and through Him to reconcile to Himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, making peace by the blood of his cross. And you, who once were alienated and hostile in mind, doing evil deeds, has now reconciled in His body of flesh by His death, in order to present you holy and blameless and above reproach before Him, if indeed you continue in the faith, stable and

steadfast, not shifting from the hope of the gospel that you heard, which has been proclaimed in all creation under heaven" (Colossians 1:15-23).

To help families drive home this truth, toward the end of this month our annual Vacation Bible School will take us on "The Great Jungle Journey," courtesy of the latest curriculum from Answers in Genesis (answersingenesis.org). It will be an epic exploration of the main themes of the Bible from Genesis to Revelation. Amid sloths, butterflies, river dolphins, and dart frogs, we will travel a fun jungle cruise that will stop at each of seven very significant ports of call. They're called the Seven Cs of History: Creation, Corruption, Catastrophe, Confusion, Christ, Cross, and Consummation. This grand sweeping overview of biblical themes will help kids take on a biblical worldview, so that they might begin to see their every day life in this world the way that God sees it and has revealed it to us in the Bible. It can help us make sense of what might appear to be merely a tangled jumble of random events, and enable us to put our existence into the logical framework of God's eternal plan.

So please join us July 22-26 on this *Great Jungle Journey* by enrolling your kids and grandkids, and by signing up to serve as a volunteer in whatever capacity you would like. Another Year Flies By!

The last 8 years have been filled with much joy as we have witnessed the growth of each of the mission congregations in the Dominican Republic. Seminary students, vicars and interns, and consecrated deaconesses serve in these congregations, in making weekly calls, teaching, carrying out mercy work in institutions for the disabled, and whatever else it might be that is needed by the church as a whole.

We cannot say enough about the amazing teamwork that has been taught, mentored, and carried out here, by the Regional Director, Pastor Ted Krey, the LAC regional staff, the Seminary, and all of the missionaries. Thanks be to God!

In the last several months, making chaplaincy visits in our region has taken me to several countries that I've never visited before: Peru, the Cayman Islands, Cuba and Panama. As I've mentioned before, it's very important for missionaries to receive pastoral care - and that is one of my two major responsibilities.

On these trips I've seen some amazing things and a range of circumstances, from the wealth of the Cayman Islands (which sometimes serves as a tax haven) to the dusty hills of Lima, Peru, covered with dilapidated houses on roads where mountain people can only travel on foot.

Nothing could have prepared me for what I saw in Cuba, when we stepped out of the airport to the taxi bay. Lining up to take people into town were classic cars between 65 – 70 years old, loudly running and lovingly maintained by their owners. The freeway was practically deserted except for the odd 1950-something car in the opposite lane. This was a world apart from our "normal" life.

While traveling in Latin America and the Caribbean, it has been humbling to see how people with very little still find contentment and joy in their lives. More than once I have

been reminded of St. Paul's words to the Philippians (4:11), that he had learned to be content regardless of his circumstances. In our various LCMS missions across the region we find multiple examples of the kind of contentment that is described in God's Word, among those who understand that 'godliness with contentment is great gain' (1 Tim. 6:6). The author to the Hebrews teaches us, 'Keep your lives free from the love of money and be content with what you have, for God has said: "*Never will I leave you, never will I forsake you*"' (Heb 13:5). Indeed, the most precious gift He has given us is Himself, and eternal life with Him in heaven.

As we once more direct our attention to the atonement Christ Jesus made for us, we see the source of our contentment in the face of all of our material needs, remembering that if '*He who did not spare his own Son but gave Him up for us all, how will He not also with Him graciously give us all things?*' (Romans 8:32). Deaconess Cheryl and I are very grateful for your prayers and your part in giving to our mission so that we can continue to serve as we do, in Jesus' name. Thank you! *Pastor Jonathan*

Dear friends in Christ,

Thank you for your patience while waiting for this newsletter. When we were in the US on "home service" (March and April), it wasn't possible to finish and send out the newsletter that Pastor Jonathan started before we began traveling. Now that we are home in the DR we are finally finding it possible.

In April, only a few days before flooding ravaged the historic geographic heart of Lutheranism in Brazil, 250 pastors and laymen of the Lutheran Church of Brazil met at Concordia Seminary in Sao Leopoldo for Disaster Response training. As coordinator for the Latin America and Caribbean Mercy Center, I arranged for Pastor Cristian Rautenberg of Argentina to be there with our LCMS staff. Together they gave presentations and lead volunteers in the physical response to the flooding. Pastor Rautenberg also conducted Disaster Response training in Chile in May. He has been a great blessing during his time serving as "subject expert" on behalf of the LCMS DR Mercy Center for the southern cone of South America. How blessed is the church when God prepares His people to work together to meet both the physical and spiritual needs of those who are in distress!

"Go and Be Reconciled" is a very popular Mercy Center workshop in LAC countries right now. I arranged for this course to be held in Jamaica in English in May - taught by Ted Kober himself, who was the founder of Ambassadors of Reconciliation. This Mercy Center workshop also took place (in Spanish) in Chile, led by Pastor Brandon Martin in March. In this current month of June, it will be taught by Pastor Neftali Garcia (of Mexico) in Panama, and Pastor Arturo Maita (of Puerto Rico) in Venezuela. Making the arrangements for these conferences is all part of my work for the Mercy Center.



VBS Mission Projects

Students and families participating in the Vacation Bible School this year will be encouraged to share their blessings with two ministries that are very important to the St. Michael family.

If interested, this would be an awesome opportunity for you to join them!

The \$\$ bills and coins collected will be split to support the ministries of a daughter of our congregation, Mariah Chilcott and the Unknown Nations ministry.

In response to the call of our Lord to *"go and tell"* and in answer to your prayers and ours, Mariah has traveled to Brazil and is working with YWAM's Viva Hope program in Monte das Aguias, initially for a 2-year commitment.

Her words: "Viva Hope was started in 2014 by a couple, the husband is Brazilian and the wife is American! They both had dreams and a vision to see the kids in Brazil grow in the Word and not of the world. Their focus is kids ages 7-14 and through working with the kids they are able to go more into the community.

We will have classes for the kids to learn things such as ballet, cooking, soccer, jiujitsu, art, hygiene classes, and possibly English classes! While the kids are in classes we also have times of discipleship for the moms who come to drop their kids off. Every Sunday we do "home visits" which means we will be going to visit the kids homes and see how they live, what kind of atmosphere their home life is, and just to be with them and their families.

In many ways I have been challenged and stretched out of my comfort zone. I have been learning so much more Portuguese, enjoying the food, and learning a lot more about the culture, myself, and God."

There will be a challenge to see if BOYS or GIRLS will bring the most \$\$ to VBS in support of these mission opportunities. Cream Pies are usually a reward for our VBS emcee of the week.



Unknown Nations: Make Jesus Known to the Ends of the Earth

A mission to spread the Gospel to the most remote and spiritually dark corners of the world working with indigenous missionaries in the 10/40 window to reach barrier-ridden people groups with the Bible. We provide humanitarian relief, plant churches, and distribute audio Bibles in areas where Jesus is completely unknown.

With your help, we can reach the unknown nations by distributing solar-powered audio Bibles spoken in their heart language through an MP3 file. This tool, called "The Treasure", is taken into their homes and consumed by people hearing the gospel in their language for the first time. As the Treasure takes root in communities, its reach extends beyond individual homes. Families and neighbors gather around this simple yet powerful device. In 2023, the Gospel of Jesus was shared with 85,000 people.


