"A Little Pastoral Flight of Fancy"

Summer is a great time of year to be in Michigan. Of course It's been pretty hot lately, but not as hot as it is down in Florida. I happen to know that firsthand, as I've taken two trips to Florida in the last four weeks in order to help out my 95 year old mother. As Memorial Day began she was found on the floor of her bedroom, taken to the hospital, and ultimately into a nursing home for rehab. My first trip down was to help her move from the hospital into rehab. The most recent trip was to help her move from rehab into a new residence in Cape Coral. I moved her into a different place than what she had been residing in for the last five years, because they were not able to assure me they could meet her needs indefinitely, whereas the new place gave me confidence they could, even as the amount of care she requires increases. The new place, a beautiful facility, with very fine people who work there, which is really the most important part of all. I'm grateful that I was able to get away to go down there and help her through these traumatic transitions. Thank you for putting up with my absence.

These most recent trips once again got me on multiple airplanes and airlines, and interacting with a number of flight attendants. As I watched them in action and more or less listened to what they rattled off on the sound system, it occurred to me that their airline profession is not unlike my own profession as a pastor. For one thing, they do a lot of talking over a microphone that, frankly, most people aren't really paying attention to. It's not that what they have to say isn't important, it's just that most everyone has heard it before and know what they are going to say. "Fasten your seatbelts... stow your tray tables... be sure your seat backs are in their upright and locked position... etc." But sometimes what they have to say could be vitally important for your very survival, like where the exits are located, where the life preservers are, and of course there are those oxygen masks that will drop down "in the unlikely event that we lose cabin pressure." By the way, many a pastor has used as an illustration about the importance of self-care the instruction to put your own oxygen mask on first before attempting to help anyone else with theirs.

Like a flight attendant, pastors also give information and instructions into a microphone that most people have heard many times before and so they don't really pay much attention to them. Take for example after the initial welcome, how we tell you to fill out the attendance card in the pew rack, using the QR code if you like, or if you're tuning in on YouTube to our livestream, to fill out the online attendance form. We also tell you when to sit or stand, even though you probably know already, and what page we are on in the hymnal even though you can see the words on the big screens.

We also say Spiritual things that you might have heard so many times before that you might glaze over. Like, we tell you that you're a sinner who has sinned against God in thought, word, and deed, both by what you have done and by what you have left undone. We also tell you that in spite of your sin God still loves you, and has given His only begotten Son, Jesus Christ, into death on the cross for the forgiveness of your sins and has raised Him from the dead for your eternal salvation. You may have heard all that before, but that doesn't mean it's not still vitally important, and really a matter of life and death not just temporally, but eternally. So pastors are not ashamed of it. Like St. Paul said, the Gospel is always "the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes it" (Romans 1:16).

Another parallel between flight attendants and pastors is that we both strive to serve you with a smile, caring for your needs and helping you to relax and enjoy the flight. Truth be told, we both come along and offer to dispose of your unwanted items as needed. Also, in addition to being your servants, we have been given the authority to tell you what to do -"stow your personal item all the way under the seat in front of you... put your electronic devices on airplane mode. . ." and while you're at it, "read your Bible ... worship regularly... give sacrificially... volunteer with VBS... and join a small group." So thank you for flying with St. Michael Lutheran Church and School. We sincerely hope (and pray) you will continue with us, joyfully joining us in serving and caring for one another, and reaching out to a lost world until Christ returns and, by His grace, we "meet the Lord in the air" (1 Thessalonians 4:17).
